Hermanos y hermanas , este tercer domingo de Pascua recordamos el conocido pasaje bíblico de los caminantes o peregrinos de Emaús. Iban comentando lo sucedido y de pronto un desconocido se les pega al camino y se mete en la conversación. Tantas veces hacemos platica con alguien en una fila, esperando, en el hospital etc. y nos sentamos a hablar y contamos lo que sucede. Pues esto es lo de hoy cuentan lo que ha sucedido, aquel a quien mataron en la cruz y que ha resucitado, esa es la novedad.

Hay decepción en aquellos hombres, hay fracaso, su Mesías al que tantos seguían lo mataron, y pareciera que ahí quedo todo, pero , como la escritura dice que tontos e insensatos eres. Todo esto tenia que suceder para que se cumplieran las escrituras.

Però todo este trayecto aquellos hombres no saben quien es el que camina con ellos y que les explico tan bonito todas las cosas, a pero eso si, al partir el pan lo reconocieron, se les abrieron los ojos, la mente, el corazón , resucitaron de su ignorancia y se les abre el entendimiento.

Como ellos también podemos contar cómo en ese mismo camino del abandono, del dejarlo todo, nos hemos encontrado con la fuerza que nos ha invitado a empezar de nuevo, a volver a Jerusalén y creer que, con de pronto la ayuda del Señor, todo es posible. Muchos matrimonios han vuelto así a vivir con renovada ilusión su amor, muchos cristianos han descubierto de esa manera la fuerza y el poder de la oración, muchos que no esperaban ya nada de la vida se han levantado y han vuelto a caminar.

El camino de Jerusalén a Emaús y de Emaús a Jerusalén es, pues, nuestro mismo camino. Pero hay algunos elementos en este relato que nos pueden ayudar a reconocer mejor a Jesús en nuestros próximos Emaús –los momentos de abandono, de huida, de pocos ánimos–, que vendrán. Primero, hay que estar atentos a los caminantes desconocidos. En ellos, puede estar presente el Señor. De ellos nos puede llegar la Palabra que ilumine nuestro corazón, que lo haga arder con nueva ilusión.

Segundo, nuestras reuniones dominicales son ese momento privilegiado para reconocer al Señor y descubrir el sentido de nuestra vida como cristianos. En torno al altar nos sabemos hermanos que compartimos el mismo pan. No en vano el momento de partir el pan fue cuando a los discípulos se les abrieron los ojos y lo reconocieron. ¿No tenemos muchos de nosotros una experiencia parecida de la Eucaristía?

Y, tercero, no hay que tener miedo en compartir con los demás nuestras experiencias de Emaús tal y como hicieron estos dos discípulos. Todos estamos en camino y todos experimentamos cansancio, desilusión y desesperanza. Quizá, en más de una ocasión, simplemente compartiendo nuestra experiencia y ayudando al que está cansado y a punto de abandonar, podemos ser el caminante desconocido que ilusione de nuevo el corazón de un hombre o de una mujer. ¿No es eso ser misionero? Nuestra meta es anunciar, proclamar, esparcir por todo lado la buena Nueva de Jesús El que murió en la Cruz pero que RESUCITO de entre los muertos. Y ahora camina con todos nosotros. Paz y Bien.

Walking Retreat

In times of trouble, our hearts long for peace and turn to God. One way to re-center ourselves on our relationship with the Lord is to retreat, or withdraw, from the world. We can do so even at home and this period of social distancing can be an opportunity to grow closer to God. Taking the time to retreat means that you are focusing inward and calling the Lord to come into your heart. The experience should help you feel more at peace and more aware that God is truly with you. One retreat you can do easily is a Gratitude Walk. If you are near a forest or beach, that is a lovely setting. But if you live in an urban or suburban area, walking around your neighborhood is just as good. The point is to go outside by yourself, unaccompanied, without checking news, social media or email. This Gratitude Walk is solely for you and God. As you leave your home, invite God to come walk with you. Say, "Lord, I know you are near and ready to be with me. Come walk beside me, and I will follow you." Then, begin your walk. You have no destination and no specific route. Simply walk wherever your feet take you. It can be for 20 minutes or an hour, depending on the responsibilities you may have at home. If you see someone you know during this retreat, kindly wave and smile at them from afar, but try not to engage in conversation. This is your time with God. Because this is a Gratitude Walk, focus your thoughts on being thankful. Remain mindful to what's around you: observe the people, animals, sights, sounds and smells. Whatever you encounter, praise God for his creation and for this moment with him. Whether it be a bird chirping, a daffodil newly bloomed or the breeze upon your face, thank God for his care and mercy upon even the most fragile of creation. A modified version of the Gratitude Walk is Gratitude Watch. Sit from the comfort of your home near a window and carefully examine everything you see. Focus on minute details and say a word of thanks for each one. You can "Thank you, Lord for (your observation). Truly, you are wonderful!" This retreat should put you in a positive mindset and help you realize that even when life is stressful, there is always something to be grateful for—most of all, God's love for us.
