**SERVICIO RESPONSIBLE****FELIZ DIA DE LAS MADRES, MUCHAS BENDICIONES.**

El domingo pasado el evangelio nos hablaba de que Jesús es el Buen Pastor, que conoce y ama las ovejas y quiere lo mejor para ellas. También era el domingo de oración por las vocaciones sacerdotales, religiosas, misioneras, nuestro deber es orar para que hayan más hombres y mujeres dispuestos a seguir a ese buen pastor sirviendo a la Iglesia. Hoy les decimos a todas las mamás que ustedes son grandes pastoras cuidando a los demás. Bendiciones.

Cuando los jóvenes terminan su secundaria y piensan en el futuro, muchos están pensando en una carrera, algo que les guste, o que tengan pasión especial y dones y talentos por eso. Otros porque ven necesidad de esa carrera en la sociedad y otros tal vez porque piensan que ganaran mucho dinero con eso y serán famosos o ricos etc.

Algo semejante a lo que aconteció en la primitiva Iglesia. No era suficiente que presidiera y administrara la Comunidad una sola persona, por el sólo hecho de ser Apóstol o compañero-discípulo de Apóstol. El número de los congregados crecía y la variedad y diferencia entre unos y otros iba aumentando. La primera lectura de la misa de este domingo nos habla de ello. En el simple núcleo de Jerusalén, convivían dos culturas. La autóctona, la de los que siempre habían vivido en la capital y se entendían entre sí en lengua aramea, aunque sus dirigentes e intelectuales conociesen y utilizasen en sus ritos el hebreo. Eran gente generalmente sencilla, desconocedora de lejanos horizontes. Los otros, los que habían vivido o descendían de los que se habían trasladado y formado núcleos en lejanos países, que habían adoptado lengua y costumbres del mundo griego, ordinariamente más cultos. De ambas culturas procedían los fieles del Señor. Cada una de ellas conservando sus peculiaridades y sufriendo sus carencias.

La descripción idílica que se nos hace en algún pasaje de los Hechos de los Apóstoles, simultaneaba con las dificultades de convivencia y colaboración que se explican en el fragmento de la misa de hoy. Era difícil atender a todos por igual si esta responsabilidad era exclusiva del que presidía las asambleas. Un episodio semejante al de lo que le ocurría a Moisés. La Iglesia, único sacramento, se diversifica en dos funciones. Surgen los diáconos. Si proclamar la Palabra era esencial, ejercer la Caridad también lo era.

En la historia de la Iglesia, junto a los que presidían, obispos, aparecen los que servían, diáconos. Estos segundos se distinguieron y se distinguen. Se llamarán: esteban, Lorenzo, Vicente, etc. etc. ...Francisco de Asís, quien no fue sacerdote, algunos le llaman diácono pero más bien al estilo de la lectura de hoy, querían servir y dedicarse a un servicio, especialmente de los necesitados. Y como ustedes saben hay diáconos transitorios que son los que se ordenaran sacerdotes, siempre antes debe ser ordenado diácono y al año más o menos , su ordenación sacerdotal. Y también los diáconos permanentes ( o sea estos son casados y se dedican a un ministerio el diaconado) al estilo de la lectura de hoy, para servir a los pobres, a los necesitados, evangelizar, ayudar con la evangelización, un servicio .

Este es un llamado realizado para todos, hombres y mujeres, ser diáconos significa el servidor, lavarnos los pies unos a otros. Buscar tu puesto en la Iglesia en como extender el Reino de Dios aquí en la tierra con tu servicio de amor y misericordia. Sirvamos, hay muchas muchas cosas por realizar en el Reino de Dios, aquí en la tierra. Paz y Bien.

## *A Note from Fr. Paul*

### An Update on our Collections

I am very pleased to announce that despite having no public Masses, and hence no collections in person, our “distance-collections” have been doing well these last two months. I am grateful for your generosity and thoughtfulness. For the last two months, since we have begun our COVID-19 precautions, our collections are at 89% of last year during this same period. I would also like to acknowledge that this would not have been possible without some of you giving large donations, above what you would normally give, just to help us during these difficult times. I cannot say thank you enough. It is a big support. We have been able to continue to employ almost all our staff. I am very proud of them, for they have all been working just as hard, maybe even harder than usual, in different ways than usual. We have done our best to try to continue all our ministries remotely, and to reach out and be responsive to your needs. More specifically, over the last two months our collections have averaged \$10,294. We did pause on our weekly reporting of our collection amounts because the amounts given have been very roller-coaster-like. At first we received very little, then mail started to come and electronic giving increased. Some donations have been people catching up for previous weeks, and some paying ahead for coming weeks. Some have even shared their stimulus checks with us! Again, thank you to all. Even those who due to your employment situations have not been able to give, our prayers are with you and I am proud to report that due to the generosity of many, we are getting through these tough times. We are one church, and these times are a testimony to that. From now on, I do plan on reporting the weekly collection, but please know that it might continue to be roller-coaster like! We will continue our services and ministries in the coming weeks and months and are hoping you will be able to continue your support.

3. Drop off the donations to the OLG Parish Hall any time from 2pm to 5pm. There will be staff to receive the donations.

- Please fill a bag (or more) with non-perishables such as dry pasta, cereal, oatmeal, vegetable oil, peanut butter, canned beans, canned fruits, canned vegetables, canned soup, canned tuna, canned meats, canned sauce, soap (dish/laundry/bar), toilet paper, paper towels, napkins, tooth paste, shampoo, dry beans, rice
- Leave the bag at your front door, with this flyer attached, on Saturday, May 16 at noon, (the leader will come by to pick it up some time before 4pm)
