Announcing the Celebration of Public Mass with Guidelines for Safety during COVID-19 Pandemic beginning Next Weekend.

Greetings, I am glad to announce that the Archbishop has given churches permission to resume the celebration of Public Masses, as long as we use precautions to minimize the risk of infection to all who attend during the pandemic. Here at OLG, after working with the Bishop's office, our staff, after recruiting volunteers, collecting supplies, beginning to train volunteers and more.... We will begin celebration of the Eucharist with social distancing restrictions next weekend starting with daily Mass, on First Friday June 5th at 8AM and Saturday June 6th at 8AM. We will have our Sunday Mass celebrations beginning on 5PM Saturday June 6th at 5PM in English, and 8AM Sunday June 7th in Spanish. If we have enough supplies and volunteers trained, we will also try to offer 10:30 AM Mass in English, on Sunday June 7th. If things go well, we'll continue with daily Mass at 8AM regularly, and if needed have the same or more Masses on the following weekend of Jun 13/14.

Part of the conditions for Public Masses during the pandemic is that we limit our numbers so as to be able to reduce the probability of infection through air or touch. Therefore, all will have to pre-register online to attend Mass. To begin we will limit daily Mass attendance to 30 persons, and Sunday Mass attendance to 65 persons. As we go forward in stages, if we find that we can increase those numbers we will. Additionally, as we get more volunteers and feel more confident in our implementation of safe practices, we will add Masses, and perhaps communion services as we find are needed.

For the coming weekend, registration for Masses will open up on Wednesday June 3rd at 7AM for the Sunday Masses, and at noon the day before for each daily Mass. After you register, you will be emailed tickets that you must bring to church. I suspect many will find registering difficult, and with limited seating especially during these first stages, many who long attend Mass and receive the Eucharist might still not be able to do this as soon as they would like. For those who may need help registering, I hope there is another Church member you can ask to help you, or you will be able to call the parish office and we will register you. I ask your patience, and hope you welcome our caution.

I am thankful to be taking this step and am working to go forward safely. I thank our staff here at OLG, they have worked hard during these difficult times. I thank you for your faith during these times. I ask that we all work together to continue to have public Masses, and not have to close again. To do that means we will all have to follow the safety precautions that we will be asking of each who attends Mass. They are briefly listed here but will be in greater detail on our registration page of our website.

Finally, I would like to emphasize that those who are over 65, or who have health conditions that put them at higher risk, are asked to continue to stay at home. Masses will continue to be livestreamed, and the Archbishop has continued to suspend the obligation to attend Mass. Additionally, in these times if you find yourself unable to register for a Sunday Mass, consider attending a daily Mass instead.

Our procedures for safety include requiring all to wear a mask over nose and mouth and keep 6 foot spacing between others (excluding family members already living under the same roof) at all times outside and inside the church and in parking lot. Sanitizing hands will be required on entrance, exit, and before receiving communion. The Body of Christ only will be distributed, and in the hand only. While in the church we ask that you refrain from moving around and minimize touching of surfaces. Our doors and windows will be open to create as much airflow as possible. All will be assigned seating by our volunteers and ushers. There will be no hymnals or Missalettes. Bathrooms will be closed for weekday Masses and allow only minimal occupancy on Sundays. We will additionally be asking for help to sanitize pews and other surfaces after each Mass.

Aviso sobre la celebración de la misa pública con pautas de seguridad durante la pandemia COVID-19 que comenzara el próximo fin de semana.

Saludos a todos, me complace anunciar que el Arzobispo ha dado permiso a las iglesias para reanudar la celebración de las Misas públicas, siempre que tomemos precauciones para minimizar el riesgo de infección a todos los que asistan durante este tiempo de la pandemia. Aquí en OLG, después de trabajar con la oficina del Obispo, con nuestro personal, reclutar voluntarios, recoger suministros, comenzar a capacitar los voluntarios y otras cosas mas. Comenzaremos la celebración de la Eucaristía con restricciones de distanciamiento social el próximo fin de semana a partir de la misa diaria, el primer viernes 5 de junio a las 8 a.m. y el sábado 6 de junio a las 8 a.m. Tendremos nuestras celebraciones de misa los domingos a partir de las 5 p. M. El sábado 6 de junio a las 5 p. M. En inglés y el domingo 7 de junio a las 8 a. M. en español. Si tenemos suficientes suministros y voluntarios capacitados, también intentaremos ofrecer misa en inglés a las 10:30 a.m., el domingo 7 de junio. Si las cosas van bien, continuaremos con la Misa diaria a las 8 AM regularmente, y si es necesario, tendremos la misma o más Misas el siguiente fin de semana del 13/14 de junio.

Parte de las condiciones para las misas públicas durante la pandemia es que limitemos la asistencia a la misa para poder reducir la probabilidad de infección por aire o contacto. Por lo tanto, todos tendrán que pre inscribirse en línea para asistir a Misa. Para comenzar, limitaremos la asistencia diaria a Misa a 30 personas y la asistencia a Misa dominical a 65 personas. A medida que avanzamos por etapas, si descubrimos que podemos aumentar esos números, lo haremos. Además, si tenemos más voluntarios y nos sentimos más seguros en nuestra implementación de prácticas seguras, agregaremos misas y quizás servicios solo para comunión si esto es necesario.

Para las misas del próximo fin de semana (6 y 7 de junio) y las siguientes, la inscripción se abrirá el miércoles 3 de junio a las 7 a.m. . Para la misas diarias se abra la inscripción al medio día del día anterior .

Después de registrarse, se le enviarán por correo electrónico las entradas que debe traer a la iglesia. Sospecho que a muchos les resultará difícil registrarse, y con asientos limitados, especialmente durante estas primeras etapas, muchos de los que asisten a misa y reciben la Eucaristía aún no podrán hacerlo tan pronto como lo deseen. Para aquellos que necesiten ayuda para registrarse, espero que haya otro miembro de la Iglesia a quien puedan pedir ayuda, o podrán llamar a la oficina de la parroquia y lo registraremos. Les pido paciencia y espero se acomoden bien a nuestra precaucion para el bien de todos. Estoy agradecido de dar este paso y estoy trabajando para avanzar con seguridad. Agradezco a nuestro personal aquí en OLG, han trabajado duro durante estos tiempos difíciles. Doy gracias por su fe durante estos tiempos. Pido que todos trabajemos juntos para continuar teniendo misas públicas, y no tener que cerrar de nuevo. Para hacerlo, todos tendremos que seguir las precauciones de seguridad que le pediremos a cada persona que asista a misa. Se enumeran brevemente aquí, pero se detallarán en nuestra página de registro de nuestro sitio web <https://www.ourladyofguadalupechurch.org/mass-registration/>

Finalmente, me gustaría enfatizar que aquellos que tienen más de 65 años, o que tienen condiciones de salud que los ponen en mayor riesgo, deben continuar en su hogar. Las misas continuarán siendo transmitidas en vivo, y el Arzobispo ha continuado con el permiso de no asistir a misa por esta situación, o sea hay una dispensa acerca de la obligación de asistir a misa. Además, en estos momentos si no puede registrarse para una misa dominical, considere la posibilidad de asistir a una misa diaria, tambien continuaremos la misa en el templo en español martes y jueves de manera que puedan asistir a misa los que tienen algun inconveniente para venir domingos por su edad o por su condicion., o por precaucion.

Nuestros procedimientos de seguridad incluyen requerir que todos usen una máscara sobre la nariz y la boca y mantener un espacio de 6 pies entre los demás (excluyendo a los miembros de la familia que ya viven bajo el mismo techo) en todo momento afuera y dentro de la iglesia y en el estacionamiento. Se requerirán manos desinfectadas antes de entrar y tambien a la salida, y por supuesto antes de recibir la comunión. El Cuerpo de Cristo solo será distribuido en la mano. Mientras esté en la iglesia le pedimos que se abstenga de moverse y minimice el contacto de las superficies. Nuestras puertas y ventanas estarán abiertas para crear la mayor cantidad de flujo de aire posible. Todos serán asignados para sentarse por nuestros voluntarios y acomodadores. No tendremos libros de canto o misales para uso publico. Los baños estarán cerrados para las misas entre semana y solo permiten una ocupación mínima los domingos. Además, pediremos ayuda para desinfectar las banca

TODOS LOS DÍAS DEBERÍAN SER PENTECOSTÉS

Llegamos al fin de la cincuentena pascual, es un recorrido hermoso por los caminos iniciales de la comunidad de los discípulos y apóstoles. Muchos hombres y mujeres dijeron si a la experiencia de la Resurrección predicada por ellos, San Pablo es uno de los ejemplos que tenemos, dejó todo, entregó todo y se arriesgó a todo para proclamar que Cristo Jesús es el Hijo de Dios, que murió en la Cruz, pero que Dios lo resucitó y que subió al cielo desde donde vino. Esta es la verdad de la fe que tenemos en el credo y es la verdad que debemos seguir pregonando.

Hay otra cosa muy llamativa que procede de San Pablo. Todo en Pablo es expresivo, muy expresivo, a la vez misterioso. “Pero el Espíritu intercede por nosotros con gemidos inefables”. ¿Y qué quiere decir? ¿Es una representación poética o fantástica? No es fácil el comentario, pero San Pablo fue un místico como narra en algunas de sus cartas. Y el conocimiento profundo de Cristo le ha llevado a ser el más grande experto en cristología. Nadie le ha podido superar en la narración trascendente, humana y divina, de nuestro Señor Jesús. Y todas esas tuvo que aprenderlas en una dimensión diferente al puro ámbito humano.

El Espíritu gime y gime por nosotros. Es nuestro guía y nuestro maestro y, sin embargo, muchos le llaman – y con razón— el gran desconocido. Apenas le conocemos. Y todo lo que desde el punto de vista oracional o eclesial hacemos y formulamos nos llegue por la inspiración del Espíritu. Por eso nosotros debemos tenerle en cuenta y, además, hacerle objeto de nuestras devociones específicas y “particulares” como lo hacemos con el Padre y con el Hijo. Y objetivamente, tanto o más que con los santos, nuestros amigos. Y si tenemos una fuerte devoción por María, la Virgen, es una razón más para rezar al Espíritu. Bueno, no se trata de hacer un baremo de devociones. Pero si poner ejemplos. Es importante no olvidar al Espíritu Santo que es quien, de verdad, nos lo ha enseñado todo.

La fiesta de Pentecostés era una celebración judía llamada de las “semanas”. Originariamente recordaba una costumbre agrícola: celebrar las “siete semanas” tras la primera ofrenda de la cebada. Después pasó a conmemorar la presencia de Dios y de su ley en el Sinaí. Y la llegada del Espíritu Santo al cenáculo fue la consecuencia que los apóstoles con valentía –y, sobre todo, Pedro cabeza de la Iglesia—comenzaran a predicar el Reino de Dios. Fue, a su vez, el nacimiento de la Iglesia como misionera. Inició ese día su Misión y ahí sigue intentando llevar la Palabra de Dios por todos los confines de la tierra.

Hoy el Espíritu nos llama a nosotros a dejarnos llevar por él, a proclamar las maravillas de Dios, a amar y a perdonar a los que nos rodean como Dios nos ama y perdona, a encontrar nuevos caminos para proclamar el Evangelio de Jesús en nuestra comunidad. Hoy es día de fiesta porque el Espíritu está con nosotros, ha llegado a nuestro corazón.

No dejemos que Pentecostés se termine hoy, poco después de la Eucaristía o al final de la jornada. Pentecostés es el principio de la acción corredentora de todos los seguidores de Cristo. El Espíritu Santo nos acompaña, y nos guía. Todos los días deberían ser Pentecostés. ¡Aleluya!

Jesús en nuestra comunidad. Hoy es día de fiesta porque el Espíritu está con nosotros, ha llegado a nuestro corazón.

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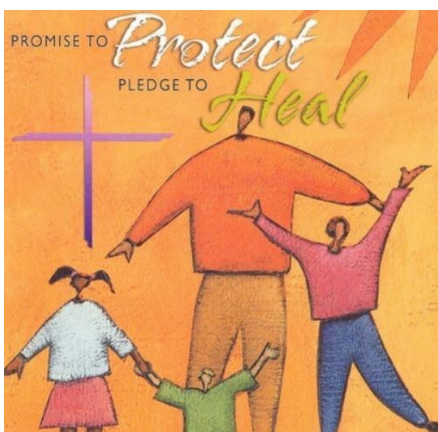

Did you Know?

A child who can describe what happened to make him feel violated or uneasy can much more easily communicate with trusted adults to stop a predator, or end a potentially dangerous situation. .

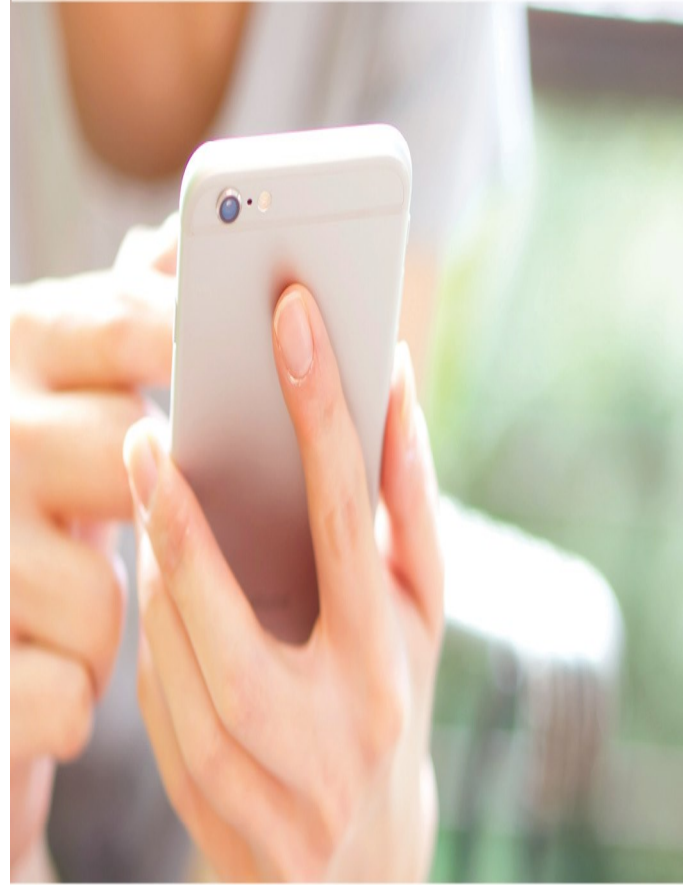

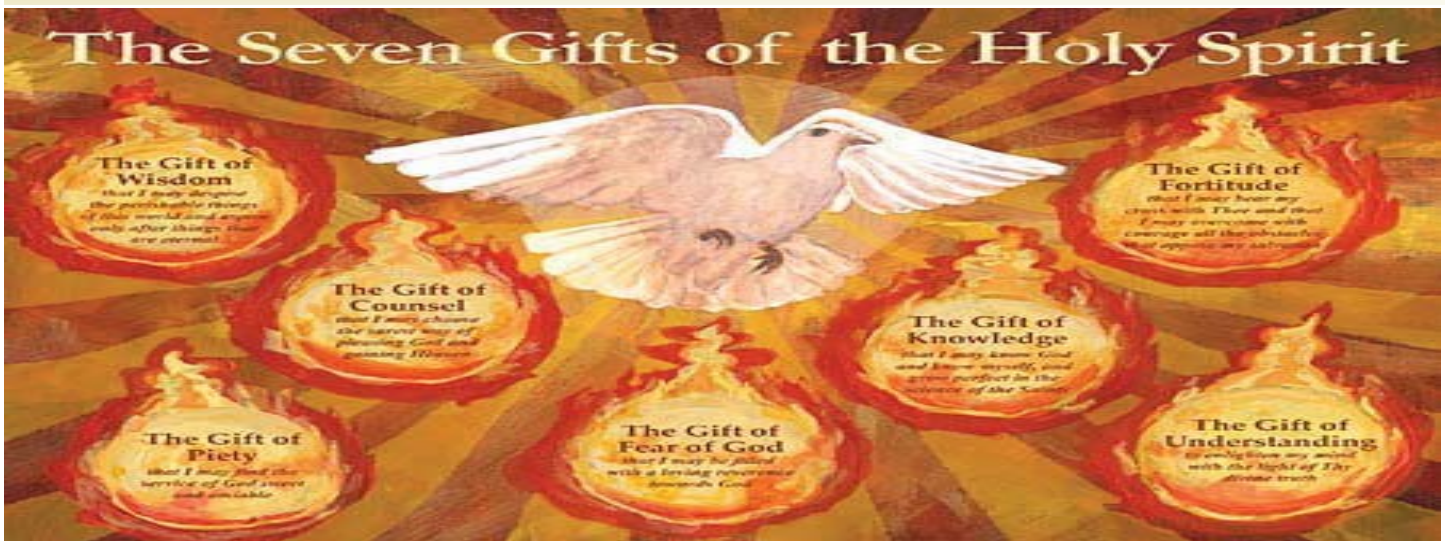

The Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit

When you were confirmed in the Church, you were exposed to and probably memorized the Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit. These gifts were freely given to you as a Temple of the Holy Spirit. Do you use them? Have you grown in them? Which gift do you need to grow in at this moment in your journey of life. As with all virtues – practice, practice and practice the virtue, until it becomes a part of your life.

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* presents the seven gifts as follows:

- ✠ **Wisdom**: it is the capacity to love spiritual things more than material ones;
- ✠ **Understanding**: in understanding, we comprehend how we need to live as followers of Christ. A person with understanding is not confused by the conflicting messages in our culture about the right way to live. The gift of understanding perfects a person's speculative reason in the apprehension of truth. It is the gift whereby self-evident principles are known, Aquinas writes;
- ✠ **Counsel** (right judgment): with the gift of counsel/right judgment, we know the difference between right and wrong, and we choose to do what is right. A person with right judgment avoids sin and lives out the values taught by Jesus;
- ✠ **Fortitude** (courage): with the gift of fortitude/courage, we overcome our fear and are willing to take risks as a follower of Jesus Christ. A person with courage is willing to stand up for what is right in the sight of God, even if it means accepting rejection, verbal abuse, or physical harm. The gift of courage allows people the firmness of mind that is required both in doing good and in enduring evil;
- ✠ **Knowledge**: with the gift of knowledge, we understand the meaning of God. The gift of knowledge is more than an accumulation of facts;
- ✠ **Piety** (reverence): with the gift of reverence, some times called piety, we have a deep sense of respect for God and the Church. A person with reverence recognizes our total reliance on God and comes before God with humility, trust, and love. Piety is the gift whereby, at the Holy Spirit's instigation, we pay worship and duty to God as our Father, Aquinas writes;
- ✠ **Fear of the Lord** (wonder and awe): with the gift of fear of the Lord we are aware of the glory and majesty of God. A person with wonder and awe knows that God is the perfection of all we desire: perfect knowledge, perfect goodness, perfect power, and perfect love. This gift is described by Aquinas as a fear of separating oneself from God. He describes the gift as a "filial fear," like a child's fear of offending his father, rather than a "servile fear," that is, a fear of punishment. Fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom (*Psalms 111:10* // *Proverbs 1:7;9:10*) because it puts our mindset in correct location with respect to God: we are the finite, dependent creatures, and He is the infinite all powerful Creator.



Please let us pray for all who are working on the front lines of this pandemic. Doctors, nurses, all who are in the healthcare profession, first responders, and all essential workers. 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**CATHEDRAL TO COMMEMORATE MEMORIAL OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY, MOTHER OF THE
CHURCH ON MONDAY, JUNE 1, 2020**

On March 3, 2018, Pope Francis established the Feast of the “Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church,” which is celebrated on Pentecost Monday. The Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels has commemorated the feast since its inception with a special Mass for Catholic school students, where thousands of students participate in the Mass, venerating the Virgin Mary with prayer, song and flowers, and two students would crown a statue of Mary as is traditionally done in her honor.

While the COVID-19 pandemic has closed parishes and schools, preventing students from personally attending the service, the Cathedral will continue the tradition virtually this Pentecost Monday, June 1, with a special Marian liturgy immediately following the livestreamed 8 a.m. Mass.

All Catholic students and the faithful are invited to join the celebration safely from home by watching the special memorial on Facebook at facebook.com/lacatholics or at lacatholics.org/mary/

During the service, students will be asked to place flowers on a picture or statue of Mary in their home and share a photo on social to virtually join the crowning ceremony at the Cathedral, where two Catholic school students will crown the statue of Mary representing all those who are not able to attend. All are invited to share their photos on social media using the hashtag #MotheroftheChurch.

May the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church, shelter us under the mantle of her protection and help us to always know the love of her Son, Jesus.
