## TRINIDAD SANTA.

*Paz y Bien. Es la fiesta de la Santísima Trinidad, hemos terminado tiempo Pascual, esta es la semana X del tiempo Ordinario. Pero Cristo sigue con la misma fuerza que siempre invitándonos a entrar en su misterio de salvación. Este domingo es especial muchos están alegres porque algunas Iglesias están abriendo sus puertas, siempre han estado abiertas porque cada uno de nosotros, cada barrio, familia es una iglesia y esas iglesias humanas son imágenes de la santa trinidad.*

*Las lecturas de hoy van directamente a un punto esencial, El Amor, La comunión la unidad. Si lo vemos desde la teología, la Santísima Trinidad es un solo Dios que, teniendo una sola naturaleza, son tres Personas que se despliegan en la Historia de la Salvación. La experiencia de Moisés con Dios es del Dios que se queda, acompañándolo, cuidándolo, iluminándolo. Ese es el Dios que debemos experimentar y vivir, el Dios que camina conmigo para introducirme a la salvación, no para castigarme, sino para animarme a caminar cada día aun con mis imperfecciones. No simplemente va de paso, sino que viene a "visitar". Se presenta revelándose él mismo con una invocación que, sin duda, se había repetido mucho como confesión de fe en Yahvé.*

*LA Santa trinidad consiste, básicamente, en que Dios Padre creó el mundo, pero este cayó en el pecado debido a que el ser humano no hizo un buen uso de su libertad; por ello Dios Padre envió a su Hijo para anunciar el camino de la salvación y para vencer al pecado muriendo en la Cruz y resucitando a una vida nueva; y después, el Padre y el Hijo, como fruto de su amor, enviaron su Espíritu para hacerse presente en medio del mundo –y dentro de nuestro corazón–, ayudándonos a caminar hacia la resurrección. La Santísima Trinidad es una experiencia de amor, unidad, comprensión, ayuda mutua, no competencia entre ellos. Creo que este punto al mundo de hoy nos viene muy bien reflexionar de acuerdo a como vivo yo, mi experiencia con Dios, pero muy importante la experiencia con los demás.*


*La segunda lectura nos interpela acerca de nuestro trato con los demás, habla de animarnos unos a otros y de buscar la felicidad, felicidad que no es ausencia de problemas, es la paz y la felicidad aun en medio de las situaciones de conflicto y dificultad. Y sabemos, con el Evangelio según san Juan, que Jesús no fue enviado por el Padre para juzgarnos sino para salvarnos, por ello murió por nosotros en la Cruz, es el Dios que quiere quedarse, que nos acompaña. Y Jesús nos dice que quien cree en Él se salva. Obviamente, no se refiere a creer superficialmente, como quien se cree lo que escucha en un programa de televisión, sino a creer en Él profundamente, haciéndolo vida, siendo coherente con el Evangelio. Y eso sólo se consigue cuando compartimos nuestra fe con el resto de la Iglesia.*

*Hoy es la oportunidad de ver nuestra relación familiar con un ejemplo de amor, ayuda, misericordia, de ánimo, fortaleza y paz. Serán nuestras relaciones familiares sanas y espirituales? La invitación es para todos, revisémonos y busquemos el camino que lleva a Dios, pero con los demás y en la esperanza del bien por todos. Paz y Bien.*

No tenga temor de empezar una conversación sobre COVID-19 con sus hijos

Si es apropiado para la edad de sus hijos, también puede mostrarles cómo buscar las respuestas en un sitio web confiable. Los mejores lugares para aprender sobre el COVID-19 son los Centros de Control y Prevención de Enfermedades (CDC, por sus siglas en inglés) y la Organización Mundial de la Salud. ### *Guidelines for Attending Mass*

If you are over 65 years of age, or have health conditions that make you more at risk, you are encouraged to stay at home. The Masses will be live streamed, and the Archbishop has given all persons dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass. Additionally, if you are unable to register for a Sunday Mass, consider a daily Mass as an alternative to your normal Sunday Mass. All who register and come to Mass will be asked to observe the following precautions: *For the benefit of all, we kindly ask:*

#### AS YOU ENTER:

1. Entrance for Mass will require pre-registration. Ask volunteer for information how to register.
2. We will have an orderly check-in of all who enter. PLEASE BE PATIENT AND,
3. Please follow the direction of all our volunteers.
4. If you have to wait outside, please maintain Social Distance of 6 feet or more.
5. Volunteers will ask if you are experiencing symptoms of COVID-19, please read list of symptoms before check-in so as to be ready to respond.
6. Wearing of **face mask is required** at all times (age 3 and up) inside Church and on Church grounds outside.
7. Sanitize hands on entry and exit.
8. Entrance through Massey Street door only.
9. Volunteers/Ushers will assign you seating.

#### ONCE YOU ARE IN CHURCH:

1. Please minimize your movement and the touching of objects while inside Church.

##### *2. To receive Communion:*

- Form a single row up the middle aisle.
- Stand 6 feet apart in line to receive communion.
- Sanitize your hands using sanitizing stations at the front of the communion line.
- Leave your mask on to receive the Eucharist in your enthroned hands.
- Walk 6 feet away, consume the Eucharist, and replace mask over nose and mouth.
- Return to your seat by side aisle, maintaining Social Distancing.
- Wait for dismissal instructions at the end of Mass.
- Continue Social Distancing as you leave church and in parking lot outside and on all parish grounds.
- Social gatherings after Mass are not appropriate at this time.

#### USE OF BATHROOMS:

1. For Daily Masses, bathrooms are locked. (Ask volunteer if there is an emergency.)

##### *2. For Sunday Mass*

- Sanitize hands BEFORE use.
- Wash with soap and water for 20 seconds AFTER use.
- Maintain Social Distancing while inside.
- Touch as few surfaces as possible.




