St. Francis never intended to found an order, rather his intention was to live a life of Penance and grow in holiness. He saw life as continual conversion. Everyday was a new day—a new opportunity to grow in Jesus Christ. Brothers soon joined Francis and the Franciscan Order was begun. His relics are in our Church, under the altar.

Try to come to Church sometime that day to venerate his relics. The Church is open on Sunday afternoons for private prayer.

Un mensaje del p. Carlos

Muchas veces hacemos lo mismo. Lo hacemos o no lo hacemos?

Cuántas veces hemos dicho lo mismo, si claro, yo voy, está bien no hay problema y al final no lo hacemos, no vamos, no cumplimos. Y otras veces aunque discutamos lo hacemos y bien hecho. Es como lo que nos da la paz y nos hace reflexionar del poder de la palabra y de la acción. Se nota cuando, nuestras palabras son eso: buenos deseos. Y, por el contrario, a veces los silencios hacen y dicen mucho. El evangelio de Mateo (21,28-32), con la parábola del padre y los dos hijos, es provocativo, pero sigue en la misma tónica de los últimos domingos. Se quiere poner de manifiesto que el Reino de Dios acontece en el ámbito de la misericordia, por eso los pecadores pueden preceder a los beatos formalistas de siempre en lo que se refiere a la salvación. Una parábola nos pone en la pista de esta afirmación tan determinada, la de los dos hijos: uno dice que sí y después no va a trabajar a la viña; el otro dice que no, pero después recapacita sobre las palabras de su padre y va a trabajar.

Lo que cuenta, podríamos decir, son las obras, el compromiso, recordando aquello de no basta decir ¡Señor, Señor!. El acento, pues, se pone sobre el arrepentimiento, e incluso si la parábola se hubiera contado de otra manera, en la que el primero hubiera dicho que sí y hubiera ido a lo que el padre le pedía, no cambiarían mucho las cosas, ya que lo importante para Jesús es llevar a cabo lo que se nos ha pedido. Sabemos, no obstante, que los dos hijos corresponden a dos categorías de personas: las que siempre están hablando de lo religioso, de Dios, de la fe y en el fondo su corazón no cambia, no se inmutan, no se abren a la gracia. Probablemente tienen religión, pero no auténtica fe. Por eso, por ley de contrastes, la parábola está contada con toda intencionalidad y va dirigida, muy especialmente, contra los primeros.

No podemos confiarnos ni un solo momento. Tenemos que vivir preocupados por agradar al Señor, siempre. Guardando con empeño sus mandamientos. Y si alguna vez fallamos, rectificar inmediatamente. Pedir enseguida perdón en el sacramento de la Penitencia. Que para eso lo ha instituido el Señor, para que podamos vivir siempre en su gracia, sin permitir que pase ni un solo momento sin su amor.

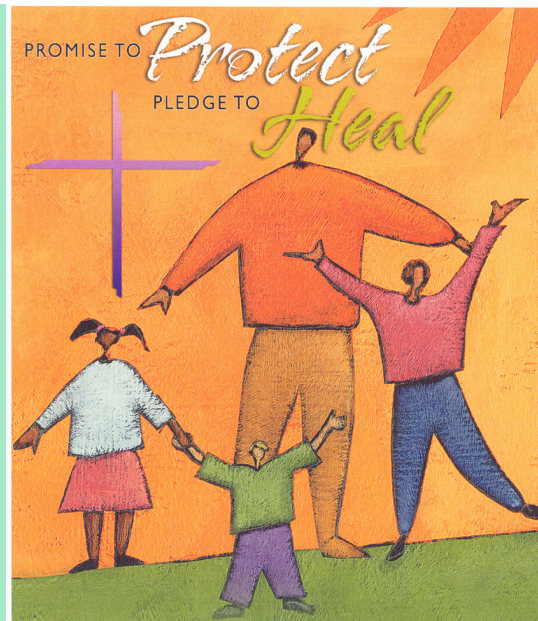
Y cuando el malvado se convierte de la maldad que hizo, y practica el derecho y la justicia, él mismo salva su vida; (Ez 18, 27). Esto es lo realmente importante para nosotros: el saber que Dios nos perdona siempre que volvamos a Él. Sólo es necesario reconocer el mal que se hizo, arrepentirse de haberlo hecho y pedirle su perdón. Y entonces todo se olvida, entonces Dios nos vuelve a abrazar como a hijos suyos.

Si el malvado recapacita y se convierte de sus delitos, ciertamente vivirá y no morirá... De este modo la liturgia, con esta primera lectura del profeta Ezequiel, una vez más recalca la infinita capacidad de perdón que Dios tiene. Así se deja bien patente que mientras hay vida hay esperanza, por muy perdido que todo nos parezca. Ojalá que esto nos haga volver los ojos a nuestro Padre Dios. Para pedirle perdón, para rogarle que tenga piedad de nosotros, para decirle que se acuerde de su misericordia sin límites.

Él le contestó: Voy, señor, pero no fue; (Mt 21, 30). Prometer es fácil, o comprometerse con alguien. A veces hasta bajo palabra de honor, o incluso bajo juramento. Mientras que se trata sólo de hablar, solemos decir que haríamos tal o cual cosa, o que nunca haremos esto o aquello. Pero cuando llega la hora de actuar, la cosa es muy distinta. Entonces la realidad se impone y se elude el sacrificio, se olvidan las promesas o se niegan los compromisos contraídos.

El Señor nos enseña en esta parábola que lo que en definitiva vale son las obras y no las palabras, los hechos y no las promesas. Sería interesante oír lo que dijimos en un momento dado cuando llega la hora de actuar. Veríamos, con rubor, cuán lejos estaban las palabras de lo que luego estaríamos dispuestos a hacer.

Jesús habla aquí a los sumos sacerdotes y a los ancianos de Israel, es decir, a lo más selecto de la sociedad de su tiempo, tanto en el plano religioso como en el civil. Pensemos, pues así es, que sus palabras nos alcanzan también a nosotros, pertenezcamos al nivel social que pertenezcamos. En definitiva también nosotros pensamos que basta con hablar y prometer, o estamos convencidos, como ellos, de que somos mejores que los demás, persuadidos de que no haríamos lo que otros hacen. Oremos para saber actuar agradando a Dios y a nosotros. Paz y Bien.



Did You Know?

Words can be warning signs of abuse

Many children will be learning in their own homes this fall, but that does not mean they will be fully protected from abuse. Sadly, most children are abused by someone considered to be a “known and trusted” person – that person may be a family member – even someone living in the same house as the child. Pay attention to the conversations your children are having, as words can be indicators that a child is being groomed or harmed. If your child or their friend(s) seem to “know” more about sexual topics than would be expected for their age, or seems unusually focused on such topics, it could be an indicator that something inappropriate and harmful is happening. Talk to your child about it, reassuring them that it is both important and safe to tell you what is happening. For more information on this topic, visit <https://lacatholics.org/did-you-know/>.

Las palabras pueden ser señales de alerta de abuso

Muchos niños estarán aprendiendo desde sus propios hogares este otoño, pero eso no significa que estarán completamente protegidos de abuso. Lamentablemente, la mayoría de los niños son abusados por alguien que se considera una persona “conocida y de confianza”, que pudiera ser un miembro de la familia, y que hasta puede vivir en la misma casa que el niño o niña. Preste atención a las conversaciones de sus hijos, ya que las palabras pueden ser indicadores de que un niño está siendo abusado o dañado sexualmente. Si su hijo/a o sus amigos parecen “saber” más sobre temas sexuales de lo que se espera para su edad, o parecen inusualmente enfocados en esos temas, esto puede ser indicador de que algo inapropiado o dañino está sucediendo. Hable con sus hijos sobre estos temas, asegurándoles que es importante y seguro que ellos le digan lo que está sucediendo. *Para obtener más información sobre este tema, visite <https://lacatholics.org/did-you-know/>.*

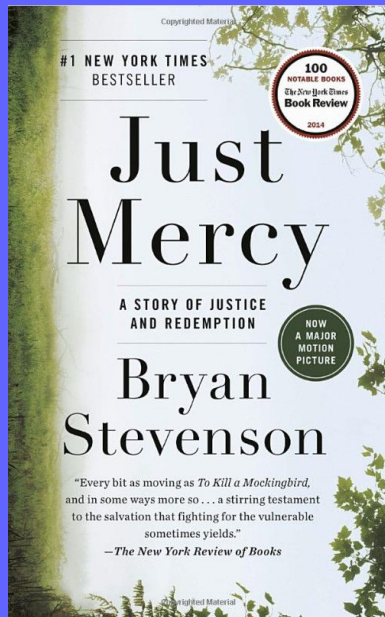

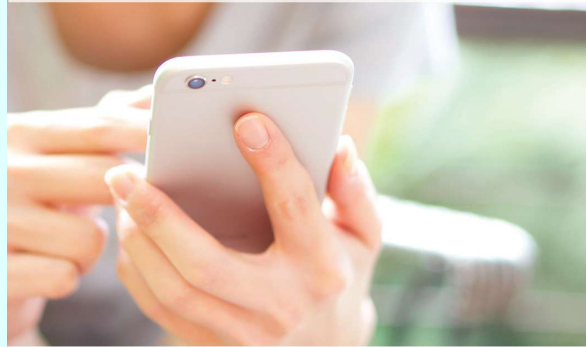
