

THE GOOD NEWS

This Sunday's readings begin with a few verses from the book of Job. First, Job complains that his nights drag on endlessly. Then, worse yet, "My days are swifter than a weaver's shuttle; / they come to an end without hope" (Job 7:6). Not exactly encouraging, these lamentations, not when taken alone.

Most of us have been there, though, and the antidote is the "good news" that Paul found so compelling that "an obligation has been imposed on me, and woe to me if I do not preach it!" (1 Corinthians 9:16). Paul felt driven to announce the gospel to as many people as possible, "to save at least some" (9:22).

This good news is the mystery of the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ, who lifted Simon Peter's mother-in-law from her sickbed with a mere touch of his hand. "The whole town was gathered at the door. He cured many who were sick with various diseases, and he drove out many demons" (Mark 1:33-34). Our woes and demons are as real as Job's, and Jesus is our savior.

No nos puede importar demasiado el hecho de que la amplia labor de la Iglesia no se reconozca. Nos tiene que quedar la satisfacción de que estamos en el camino correcto. Que, salir al encuentro de los que sufren, es para nosotros un motivo de gloria y de crecimiento espiritual y humano, y es la misma posibilidad o invitación para todos, todos.

El Reino de Dios comienza allá donde existe un surtidor de caridad, una semilla de cariño, una mano tendida al abatido. Qué gran lección la de Jesús en el evangelio de este domingo: sale con sus discípulos de la sinagoga y, en la casa de Pedro, actúa maravillosamente. Una vez más habla con autoridad: hace lo que dice.

Habla, camina, entra en casa de Pedro y cura. Las obras le acompañan. Las obras le hacen eco. No necesita más refrendo ni más promoción que su infinita misericordia. Repito: ¡sus obras le acompañan! ¡Sus obras le hacen coro!



Cuesta, y mucho, entregarse con generosidad y curar sin pedir nada a cambio. Pero, lo cierto es que, quien abre los ojos encuentra muchas “suegras” de carne y hueso y en forma de pobreza a su paso. Meditemos y hagamos nuestra esta oración que es muy muy apropiada para este caso.



4:00 PM – 6:00 PM


Spanish Mass & Ashes Distribution – Church Parking Lot
