

JESUS' WAY

This Sunday's readings present a contrast between "Jesus' way" and the "old way." An example of the old way is the law given to Moses and Aaron about leprosy: the leper was unclean and cast out of the community. Jesus' way is the opposite: the leper is reached out to, touched, and finally cured.

Nor ought we think of the “old way” as restricted to the days of Moses and Aaron, or even to the “old” testament. The difference between the old way and Jesus’ way arises in our own lives. We still choose, every day, to live in our old way or in Jesus’ way.

Jesus dared to touch a leper, disregarding the old way. The leper then was changed forever. He felt a calling. He couldn’t keep himself from proclaiming that he had been touched by Jesus (even though Jesus told him not to!). Once Jesus touches us, we are called to proclaim his way.

Este domingo sexto del tiempo ordinario nos trae en las lecturas algo muy hermoso: es necesario pasar por el arrepentimiento y reconocimiento de mis faltas para poder acercarme a la gracia de Dios. Porque si no se contaminaban los peregrinos pero a la vez alguien había con la posibilidad de sanación. Claro que si, que podía curar la lepra, y ese era el profeta, pero el profeta del señor. Imaginemos el dolor de las personas no sólo físico sino psicológico y espiritual de estar separados y señalados. En aquella sociedad existían los rabinos que nunca se atrevían a tocar un leproso porque no les convenía porque quedarían impuros al tocar a alguien enfermo pero era más por su bienestar económico, pero llega alguien que no le importan esos beneficios que se puedan perder y este es Jesús, que se acerca al hombre o mujer enfermo y lo toca y lo sana porque Jesús no está pensando en una cuestión legal Jesús está pensando en la misericordia en devolverle la libertad a esta persona en enviarla a que sea testimonio de sanación.

Hoy en día es el pecado quien nos hace auto aislarnos o separarnos, pero no nos moriremos, si a tiempo reconocemos las fuentes de salvación, que son: sacramento de reconciliación y el Dios de la vida que me espera con los brazos abiertos para perdonarme y devolverme a la comunidad, a la familia, no estamos solos, no estamos perdidos, podemos estar en pecado pero si tengo la decisión de volver y de arrepentirme voy a encontrar misericordia, amor y perdón, no hay pecado que Dios no quiera perdonar, ninguno, sólo es que la persona esté arrepentida y haga cuenta de una vida nueva que Dios se alegrará de darle su perdón. Nuestra lepra es curable, con el sacramento de la reconciliación con la eucaristía con la oración con el amor al prójimo con la práctica de la bondad todo eso cura nuestra letra no lo olvidemos estamos a tiempo, no estamos perdidos hoy hoy es mi oportunidad de volver a la casa de Dios a mi casa. Iniciemos la cuaresma con las actitudes de la vuelta a la casa del Padre, bendiciones.
