### HISTORY OF SALVATION

The first reading this week continues the “history of salvation” narrative that we hear throughout Lent this year. The story was among the best-loved in the Jewish tradition (surely Joseph told the story to young Jesus as he formed him in the ways of their faith); the early fathers of the Church were very fond of it as a means of explaining the sacrifice of Christ on the cross. The overall tone of the first reading, psalm, and second reading seems a little incongruous with the dazzling Gospel, until we remember that the Transfiguration was placed as the Gospel for this Sunday precisely to remind us of the glory that awaits those who live faithfully and obediently to the will of God. In the life of Jesus, it is a preview of the glory of his resurrection; for us it is a glimpse of the destiny of those who continue, as we heard in last week’s Gospel, to repent and believe in the Good News.

# Un mensaje del p. Carlos

Esta semana nos encontramos una vez más con la revelación de Dios a través de la manifestación, ( que significa hacerse presente) porque cada vez que Dios decide hacerse presente en el Antiguo Testamento o en el Nuevo, se realizan cambios en los que están siguiéndolo, o alrededor de Él. Cambios de: situaciones, realidades, externas y también internas. Su manifestación es capaz de ir más allá de lo que nosotros podemos ver o palpar. Tenemos a Abraham, Isaac, Pedro, Santiago y Juan, quienes son hoy testigos de esa revelación de Dios.

En Abraham por ejemplo la manifestación se presenta haciéndole una promesa de descendencia en contra de todo pronóstico, la respuesta de Fe de nuestro padre Abraham es lo que debemos seguir de cerca, fe y obediencia incondicionales en el Dios de la promesa. Y en Jesús tenemos esa manifestación transfigurada o sea se convirtió y sin decir nada, les hace tener esa revelación, se transparentó. Significa que podían ver ellos desde la fe aquella iluminación y escuchar aquella voz: “este es mi hijo amado, escúchenlo “. Pero no solo eso, sino que también hay un mensaje en ambas manifestaciones o revelaciones. A uno diciéndole, “toma a tu hijo único, al que amas, a Isaac, y vete a la tierra de Moria y ofrécelo allí en holocausto en uno de los montes que yo te indicare” a tu hijo, imagínense al descendiente. Y en el nuevo testamento dice: este es mi hijo amado escúchenlo. Estos dos eventos representan el caminar de la vida, un camino que no recorreremos solos, sino que Dios está a nuestro lado, ahí va conmigo, con usted, con todos. Abraham es símbolo de la confianza en Dios, lo deja que camine en su vida con Él. Abraham nos enseña como tener esperanza de que Dios no me deja nunca, aun cuando estoy en esos momentos cruciales como estuvo él. La montaña o El Monte, ahí donde Dios se sigue revelando, en el silencio de la nada, ahí está Él. Es el símbolo de la búsqueda de Dios, del encuentro con El Dios que nos ha creado y me invita a ofrecerle mi sacrificio, pero no nos pide más que dejemos ahí nuestras cargas, nuestros errores, que reconozcamos cara a cara que estamos dispuestos a votar esas cargas y a tomar su presencia salvadora.

La cuaresma es la invitación de dejar todo, salir de nuestras comodidades, de la rutina, que llevemos las cargas que tenemos a Él y que las dejemos que se conviertan en un momento de intimidad, conversación y revelación con Dios que nos sigue apoyando en nuestro caminar. No es una prueba, se trata de una manifestación, donde lo que tenemos que expresar y acoger es la fe, la confianza en que con Dios estaremos siempre bien, a pesar de lo que estemos enfrentando por más difícil que sea sigue ahí a nuestro lado, deteniendo nuestra debilidad y convirtiéndola en fortaleza. Dejemos la que la luz de Cristo nos envuelva, dejemos que su voz llegue a nuestros oídos y nuestros corazones y que se transformen en un camino a seguir junto con todos los que creen y confían en Él. No iremos solos, Él nos ira abriendo los ojos de la fe. Esa subida al monte implica un esfuerzo, pero a la vez nos facilitara la visión de Dios. En esta cuaresma dejemos que ese camino se llene de muchos hombres y mujeres que quieren sanarse, servir, entregarse como Jesús lo hizo. Es la oportunidad de todos nosotros, no lo olviden, El camina con nosotros. Subamos a la montaña de nuestras vidas y pidámosle a El que nos transforme, de acuerdo a su voluntad, pero al igual que Abraham y los discípulos debemos estar abiertos a la Fe. Bendiciones.



When you start to talk to your children about inappropriate touching and basic sexual abuse prevention safety rules, be mindful that children can easily be confused by even the best of any adult's intentions, which underscores why all adults have a responsibility to adhere to the highest of standards in their relationships with children. Consider that another good reason to be involved in the activities your children participate in is that it allows you to get to know the adults who work regularly with them. That way, if your child brings a confusing scenario to you, you can more easily discuss the circumstances with your child and the adult involved, with the goal of working towards better behaviors. 
