

TOTAL ALLEGIANCE

In previous weeks we have seen how the theme of covenant—as a preparation for the baptismal covenant celebrated at Easter—occupies an important place in our cycle of Lenten readings. The notion of covenant as a relationship between two parties carries with it an expectation of mutual accountability and fidelity to the terms of the covenant.

When God forged the covenant with the Jewish people on Mt. Sinai, it was a pledge of God's protection, and it would forever permit them familiar access as the Chosen People. For their part, the Jewish people were to observe the dictates of the law, summarized most succinctly here in the form of the Ten Commandments. To be in a covenantal relationship with the Lord God requires an exclusive relationship, just as discipleship with Jesus—ritualized in baptism—demands a total allegiance to Him and none other.

Dios sabe siempre lo que más necesitamos.

El tercer domingo de Cuaresma nos adentra, justo en su punto, las lecturas nos hacen un claro llamamiento a ir hacia dentro, a profundizar, a dejar de lado imágenes e ídolos y girar nuestras vidas hacia el que dice de sí mismo: «soy el Señor, tu Dios».

Nos encontramos con esta propuesta de mirada interior tanto en el texto del Éxodo, cuando Dios entrega a Moisés los Mandamientos, como en el texto de Juan. En la lectura que nos ofrece el Evangelio de hoy Jesús se enfrenta a quienes han convertido el templo en un mercado donde no hay verdadero encuentro con su Padre, sino una suerte de compra y venta de "favores divinos".

Esta invitación, en medio de nuestra segunda Cuaresma pandémica quizás nos ayude a seguir despojándonos de lo superficial para avanzar en lo esencial de nuestras vidas.

Cuando Dios y Moisés se encuentran y le propone los mandamientos, o sea La ley, que no es un listado de prohibiciones, sino que quiere ser un camino luminoso por el que el pueblo puede avanzar hacia Yahvé. Esa ley comienza reclamando hacer memoria de quién es este Dios: «Yo soy el Señor, tu Dios, que te saqué de Egipto, de la esclavitud. No tendrás otros dioses frente a mí». Esa es la alianza para siempre, un solo Dios, un solo pueblo, un solo Señor.

Todo está bien planeado, cuidar el mundo, hacerlo prosperar para beneficio de todos, y así vamos a encontrarnos con el Dios de la Creación que te ama y que te está invitando a volver hacia Él, solo en Él podemos encontrar palabras de vida eterna y de misericordia. Por eso es que cuando nos desviamos sufrimos mucho, nos golpeamos, nos terminamos en otras palabras porque vamos tras lo que no conocemos, lo que parece un gran proyecto, pero no lo es. Amar a Dios, al otro y a mi mismo. Eso no nos hace acabar con nuestra vida, al contrario, nos lleva a

promover todo tipo de vida entre nosotros, especialmente la vida de la salvación.

Living Lent as a Family - Part 2 of 4



2020-2021 OLG Catechumens and Candidates

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the official process in which one is baptized (Catechumens), professes faith to the Catholic Church (Candidate), or for a baptized Catholic to complete their initiation process with the Sacraments of First Communion and Confirmation. This Sunday is the first of three scrutinies.

First Scrutiny

The scrutinies are celebrated in order to deliver the elect from the power of sin and Satan, to protect them against temptation, and to give them strength in Christ. The

scrutinies and their accompanying exorcisms are a series of rites that cannot be condensed in time; they need time "to work." Nor should we diminish their ritual symbols of silence, posture, litany, and hand laying. Laying on hands is required in the Scrutinies. The Scrutiny takes place within the Liturgy of the Word led by a priest or deacon. The next 3 Sundays we will be celebrating the scrutinies.

Jesus you prayed, "I revealed your name to those whom you gave me out of the world. They belonged to you, and you gave them to me, and they have kept your word. Now they know that everything you gave me is from you, because the words you gave to me I have given to them, and they accepted them and truly understood that I came from you, and they have believed that you sent me. I pray for them. I do not pray for the world but for the ones you have given me, because they are yours." 
Would you like to receive the Eucharist in your home during these times of Pandemic?




