

Lent, a Season of the Word

Each year on the First Sunday of Lent we hear one of the Gospel accounts of the temptation of Jesus. In Luke's account, the devil cites the scriptures repeatedly, urging Jesus to interpret them in a false, self-serving way—if God sends angels to protect those whom God loves (as it says in Psalm 91), then prove it! But Jesus resists this insidious temptation by turning to scripture passages that tell of right relationship with God—living by God's word, trusting in God, and worshiping God alone.

Jesus himself listened to the inspired word of God and let it shape and form him. Through the liturgy, we do the same. The readings we hear at Mass can teach us, but that is not their primary function. Rather, the scriptures are meant to reveal the Lord to us, to let us experience his presence, and to form us in our Christian identity. Christ's presence is realized by his spoken word, "since it is he himself who speaks when the Holy Scriptures are read in the Church" (Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, 7). In the readings proclaimed at Mass, we hear the voice of Christ himself.

MIREMOS A LA CRUZ

Por otro lado, encontramos la experiencia de desobediencia de la comunidad israelita que han dejado el camino de los preceptos de salvación y de obediencia y se han adentrado en la infidelidad y en la búsqueda de otros dioses, de poder, de apariencias y han dejado el corazón de carne cambiándolo por uno de piedra. Se han vuelto desobedientes, viviendo al margen de los mandamientos y de la alianza pactada con Dios.

El libro de crónicas relata la infidelidad del pueblo de los sacerdotes de todos aquellos y dice mancharon la casa de Jerusalén. Tantas veces Dios envió a los profetas para advertirles, guiarlos, llevarlos de nuevo al camino, pero no, siempre persisten en buscar las experiencias de una vida sin el Dios de Israel.

Hemos sido salvados por la gracia, no por nada de nuestra cosecha, sino por un don de Dios. Somos obra de arte de Dios, creados en Cristo Jesús. Que la gracia y la luz de Jesús, el Señor, esté siempre con nosotros, no dejemos escapar este don de su misericordia, salvados por nada, por puro amor suyo. ustedes.

Si fuéramos realmente conscientes de cuánto nos ama Dios ¿cómo podríamos permanecer indiferentes o rehusar nada a Dios? Si creemos firmemente que él nos encuentra dignos de amor, ¿cómo pudiéramos no poner nuestra confianza en él? Él no nos fuerza: simplemente nos invita: "Éste es mi amor hacia ti; ¿te gustaría aceptarme a mí y a mi amor? ¿Te gustaría compartir mi amor con otros amándolos a ellos también?" ¿Qué respuesta le damos a Dios, por medio de Jesucristo?

En nuestras Iglesias y en la mayoría de nuestros hogares damos al crucifijo un lugar de honor. ¿Quiere ello decir que debemos amar las cruces? No, pero indica que creemos en nuestro Señor crucificado y que le amamos de corazón. Él nos salvó por su cruz y resurrección. Es a Cristo Jesús a quien alzamos nuestra mirada buscando fuerza para llevar las cruces que vienen a nosotros en las dificultades de la vida. También le miramos buscando alegría y felicidad en nuestro peregrinar y buscando vida eterna más allá de la muerte. Con Jesús celebramos ahora, en la eucaristía, el memorial de su sacrificio en la cruz y

de su resurrección. ¿No es algo grandioso? No dejemos de venerar el sacrificio y la entrega de Dios por nuestra salvación. Miremos a la cruz y recordemos, que por sus llagas fui salvado o salvada. **Amen. Bendiciones.**

The practice of celebrating the Stations began in Jerusalem and then spread throughout the Church by the Franciscans. During the Stations, there will be an opportunity for Confession.



2020-2021 OLG Catechumens and Candidates

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the official process in which one is baptized (Catechumens), professes faith to the Catholic Church (Candidate), or for a baptized Catholic to complete their initiation process with the Sacraments of First Communion and Confirmation. This Sunday is the second of three scrutinies.

Second Scrutiny

The scrutinies are celebrated in order to deliver the elect from the power of sin and Satan, to protect them against temptation, and to give them strength in Christ. The scrutinies and their accompanying exorcisms are a series of rites that cannot be condensed in time; they need time "to work." Nor should we diminish their ritual symbols of silence, posture, litany, and hand laying. Laying on hands is required in the Scrutinies. The Scrutiny takes place within the Liturgy of the Word led by a priest or deacon.

Prayer for the scrutinies:

Jesus you prayed, "I revealed your name to those whom you gave me out of the world. They belonged to you, and you gave them to me, and they have kept your word. Now they know that everything you gave me is from you, because the words you gave to me I have given to them, and they accepted them and truly understood that I came from you, and they have believed that you sent me. I pray for them. I do not pray for the world but for the ones you have given me, because they are yours." We join you in praying for these catechumens and candidates that you may keep them and protect them, that they may stay in you and may come to full union with you and your church at the Easter Vigil.





COVID-19 Vaccine Q&A

Brought to you by the OLG Social Justice Ministry

Q: Is the Covid-19 vaccine safe? I don't want to take it until I know the results from other people

A: Yes, the 3 US-approved vaccines (Moderna, Pfizer, and Johnson & Johnson) are deemed safe. In the US, more than 80 million vaccine doses have been administered. A small fraction of people experience non-severe side effects from

the vaccine. This comes after testing on volunteers prior to approval by the Centers for Disease Control (CDC).

Q: Are the 3 vaccines effective? Will they protect me?

A: If a fully vaccinated person gets the disease, they do not experience a severe form. A total of *0 hospitalizations and 0 deaths* have been recorded among those fully vaccinated by Johnson & Johnson, Pfizer, and Moderna.

Also, the vaccine makes you less likely to transmit the disease to others, some of whom are unable to receive their own vaccine due to existing health conditions.

Q: Did the Church say not to take the Johnson & Johnson vaccine?

A: No, Church teaching says “it is morally acceptable to receive Covid-19 vaccines” *including Johnson & Johnson.*

The US Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) has encouraged people, *only if they have a choice*, to prefer Moderna or Pfizer because J&J’s research drew on fetal stem cells. The California Catholic Conference says we have an obligation to protect ourselves, our families, our friends, and the community by vaccinating as soon as feasible.

Q: How do I get a vaccine?

A: There is a state-wide website myturn.ca.gov and people may also contact a medical provider. Eligibility criteria are expanding from the most vulnerable to the lesser vulnerable, according to Government guidelines.




