Indoor Mass and Safety of All

A request from Fr. Paul

Greetings and Peace. Our move to the indoor Masses has been well received, and many are thankful to be back inside the Church once again. I am pleased that we are inside, and pleased we are also still providing an outdoor option in your cars in the parking lot. My greatest desire is to have enough space so that all who wish to come may. It is also my responsibility to work hard to see that we are welcoming all back SAFELY. Towards both these objectives I ask your cooperation in the following areas:

1. Wearing of a mask always covering nose and mouth while inside the church or on church grounds is required. Medical masks are preferred, but multi-layer fabric masks that fit snugly at top and bottom are acceptable. Bandana style masks, and masks with air valves are not acceptable since they have been shown to be ineffective. Also, most paper masks are disposable, and meant for one time use, they do lose their effectiveness when worn beyond one day.
2. Even while wearing masks, we still require 6' social distancing with members not of the same household.
3. Please sanitize your hands as you come into church, and before receiving communion.
4. For ventilation, we leave windows and doors open. Some days, especially in the morning and evening Masses, it can be a bit chilly in Church. Please dress warmly.
5. Our volunteers are making Mass possible during the pandemic. Please thank them for their service and follow their directions. Thank You.
6. We do still ask you to [register for Mass online](#) (or call parish office). **If you register and then change your mind, it really helps us if you cancel your reservation, so someone else can come.** To cancel a registration, just go online exactly like you are registering for a particular Mass. The system will recognize you are already registered and then ask you if you wish to cancel. Registrations now close only one hour before Mass. If you are not registered, and there is room, we will allow entrance on a first come first serve basis.

Again, I ask the cooperation of all, for the safety of all, and in love of neighbor.

Un mensaje del p. Carlos

MORIR PARA GANAR LA VIDA

Hola a todos, estamos en el último domingo del tiempo cuaresmal, el próximo es ya Domingo de Ramos, y las lecturas de la liturgia de hoy culminan el mensaje de las promesas de Dios para la humanidad, que se consumarán con la pasión, muerte y resurrección del Señor.

La Nueva Alianza de Dios que supera la Antigua Alianza con Israel para abrir la comprensión de que Dios cuida de toda la humanidad -yo seré su Dios y ellos serán mi pueblo-, se manifiesta en el perdón y la misericordia - todos me conocerán cuando perdone sus crímenes y no recuerde sus pecados- que nos trae la entrega por amor de Jesús en su pasión y muerte -se ha convertido para todos los que le obedecen en autor de salvación eterna-. La promesa de la salvación y la plenitud de Dios llega a su culmen con la cruz de Jesús.

Al contrario de la alianza con el pueblo del Antiguo Testamento, ahora la salvación o la alianza o la experiencia de Dios se ha abierto a todo el mundo. Es lo que hoy escuchamos “algunos querían ver a Jesús”, eran extranjeros o no judíos y Jesús accede verlos y empieza hablando de la muerte que da la vida, para vivir hay que morir. Algo incomprensible a los ojos del mundo del momento y posiblemente hoy. Morir no solo físicamente, es el cambio, dejar aquello que no da paz, que no da alegría, que nos sofoca en el mundo de la esclavitud, de la ansiedad, nervios, competencia. Morir a tantas cosas para recobrar tu ser más íntimo y su sustancia elemental o sea lo que Dios ha puesto en nosotros al crearnos. Pero para ver eso debo dejar el camino libre, aclararlo, limpiarlo. Y es que la entrega de Jesús es lo que cambia lo anterior por siempre, Él es el Cordero inmolado, sacrificado, muerto en la cruz, pero por nosotros y de una vez para siempre. Es la alianza basada en el amor al prójimo. Es ahí cuando lo glorifica Dios, se hace El Salvador del mundo. Por eso la expresión para que el grano de trigo de fruto tiene que morir.

Para hablar de su muerte fecunda el Señor se compara a sí mismo con un grano de trigo: es necesario que para dar fruto Él se entregue a sí mismo que “caiga en la tierra” y que “reviente” como el grano de trigo. Solo así podrá dar paso a una vida nueva, podrá producir, “fruto abundante”, fruto de redención para la humanidad entera, fruto de vida eterna para todos los que crean en Él.

Todos los que queremos recibir este fruto de redención, tenemos que seguirlo, es decir participar de ese morir para vivir. Por su Hijo muerto en la Cruz para el perdón de los pecados, Dios ha realizado ya la nueva y eterna alianza prometida a su pueblo a través de los profetas de manera particular por Jeremías hoy en la primera lectura.

Aquí tenemos hoy la posibilidad de adentrarnos completamente en la cuaresma y su ofrecimiento de renovación de la alianza dada para todos, especialmente por nuestro arrepentimiento y cambio de vida. Aún estamos a tiempo. Bendiciones.

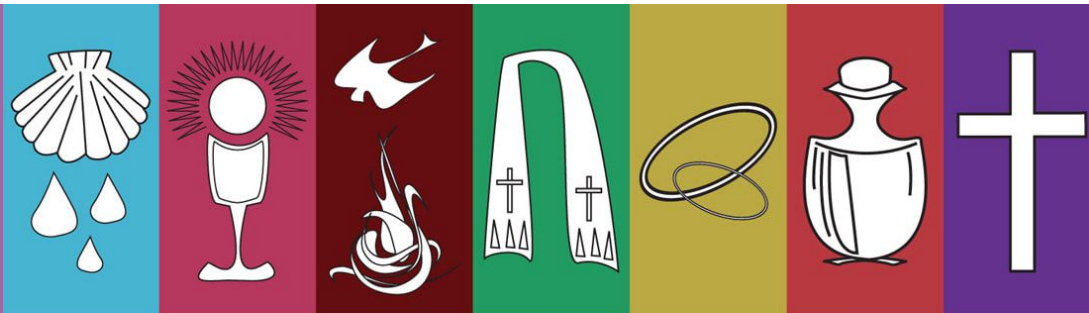

2020-2021 OLG Catechumens and Candidates

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the official process in which one is baptized (Catechumens), professes faith to the Catholic Church (Candidate), or for a baptized Catholic to complete their initiation process with the Sacraments of First Communion and Confirmation. This Sunday is the final of three scrutinies.

Third Scrutiny

The scrutinies are celebrated in order to deliver the elect from the power of sin and Satan, to protect them against temptation, and to give them strength in Christ. The scrutinies and their accompanying exorcisms are a series of rites that cannot be condensed in time; they need time "to work." Nor should we diminish their ritual symbols of silence, posture, litany, and hand laying. Laying on hands is required in the Scrutinies. The Scrutiny takes place within the Liturgy of the Word led by a priest or deacon.

Prayer for the scrutinies:

Jesus you prayed, "I revealed your name to those whom you gave me out of the world. They belonged to you, and you gave them to me, and they have kept your word. Now they know that everything you gave me is from you, because the words you gave to me I have given to them, and they accepted them and truly understood that I came from you, and they have believed that you sent me. I pray for them. I do not pray for the world but for the ones you have given me, because they are yours." We join you in praying for these catechumens and candidates that you may keep them and protect them, that they may stay in you and may come to full union with

you and your church at the Easter Vigil.

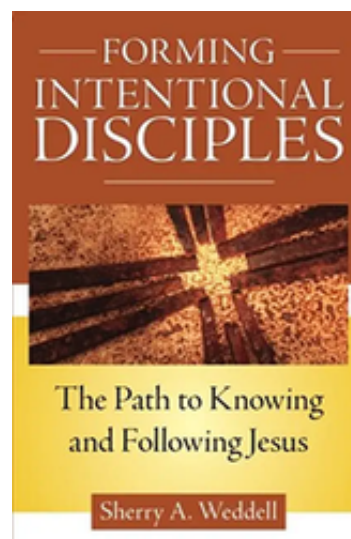

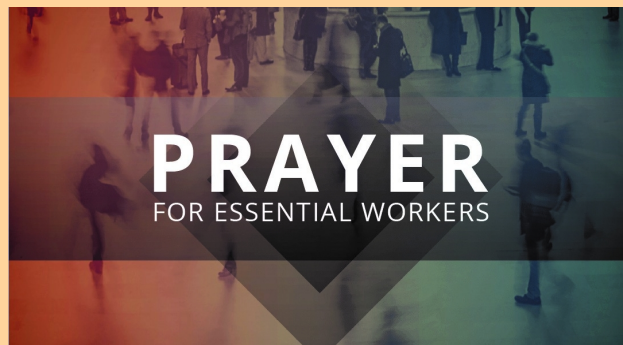

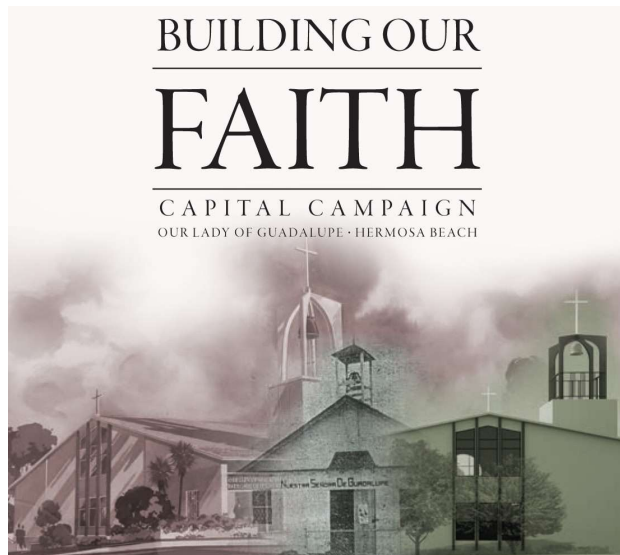

COVID-19 Vaccine Q&A

Brought to you by the OLG Social Justice Ministry

Q: Is the Covid-19 vaccine safe? I don't want to take it until I know the results from other people

A: Yes, the 3 US-approved vaccines (Moderna, Pfizer, and Johnson & Johnson) are deemed safe. In the US, more than 80 million vaccine doses have been administered. A small fraction of people experience non-severe side effects from the vaccine. This comes after testing on volunteers prior to approval by the Centers for Disease Control (CDC).

Q: Are the 3 vaccines effective? Will they protect me?

A: If a fully vaccinated person gets the disease, they do not experience a severe form. A total of 0 hospitalizations and 0 deaths have been recorded among those fully vaccinated by Johnson & Johnson, Pfizer, and Moderna.

Also, the vaccine makes you less likely to transmit the disease to others, some of whom are unable to receive their own vaccine due to existing health conditions.

Q: Did the Church say not to take the Johnson & Johnson vaccine?

A: No, Church teaching says "it is morally acceptable to receive Covid-19 vaccines" including Johnson & Johnson.

The US Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) has encouraged people, *only if they have a choice*, to prefer Moderna or Pfizer because J&J's research drew on fetal stem cells. The California Catholic Conference says we have an obligation to protect ourselves, our families, our friends, and the community by vaccinating as soon as feasible.

Q: How do I get a vaccine?

A: There is a state-wide website myturn.ca.gov and people may also contact a medical provider. Eligibility criteria are expanding from the most vulnerable to the lesser vulnerable, according to Government guidelines.
