break open the tomb.


Where I've buried my willingness to forgive,

Un mensaje del p. Carlos

Paz y Bien, Aleluya, Aleluya, Cristo Ha Resucitado.

El mensaje de hoy es de vida como todo en la vida de Dios, vida y vida en abundancia. La resurrección es de vida y es de cada día, "Jesús ha resucitado" y naturalmente todos estamos de acuerdo; pero aunque conocemos de sobra estas palabras, es posible que el anuncio no siempre transmita la expectativa y el entusiasmo que debería causarnos. En la misa de la vigilia hacemos un recorrido con las lecturas por la historia de la Salvación hasta terminar con el nacimiento, la muerte y la resurrección de Jesucristo, nuestro Señor.


Pero el milagro de la Pascua encierra en sí mismo el poder que es capaz de llevarnos hacia las profundidades del Corazón de Jesús. La resurrección de Cristo contiene la promesa de que nosotros mismos podremos experimentar la resurrección en forma palpable, que se manifiesta en una vivencia renovada del amor a Dios y al prójimo, la gracia necesaria para perdonar y la fuerza espiritual para llevar una vida consagrada a Dios.

Al comenzar esta temporada de Pascua, imitemos la actitud de María de Betania, la hermana de Marta, que se sentaba a los pies de Jesús para escucharle, y pidámosle al Señor que nos enseñe a meditar detenidamente en el milagro de la Pascua. Es indudable que vale la pena dedicar tiempo y esfuerzo a esta valiosa reflexión, porque la resurrección de Jesús es el acontecimiento más trascendental de la historia humana, es decir, el suceso que más nos toca personalmente y al que debemos atribuirle un gran valor y la mayor importancia.

Algo de vida o muerte. En su carta a los fieles de Roma, San Pablo les dijo: "Si con tu boca reconoces a Jesús como Señor, y con tu corazón crees que Dios lo resucitó, alcanzarás la salvación" (Romanos 10,9). Esto significa que cada vez que rezamos el Credo en la Santa Misa "reconocemos" públicamente que Jesús murió por nuestros pecados y que resucitó de entre los muertos. Ahora, lo que nos falta determinar con seguridad es si realmente "creemos con el corazón" lo que dicen estas palabras.

Este ofrecimiento de la ciudadanía celestial es lo que hace que la Pascua sea tan especial; esta es precisamente la razón por la cual Cristo vino al mundo. Dios nos amó tanto que envió a su Hijo a salvarnos "para que todo aquel que cree en él no muera, sino que tenga vida eterna" (Juan 3,16). En efecto, el mensaje de la Pascua nos lleva a dirigir la mirada hacia el cielo, no una sola vez, sino en todo momento. Lo trágico es que hay personas que sienten más entusiasmo cuando encuentran una buena oferta en una tienda que cuando escuchan el hecho extraordinario de que las puertas del cielo se han abierto para ellas.

Esto no quiere decir que las cosas materiales y pasajeras que necesitemos o deseemos en esta vida no sean buenas en sí mismas, pero lo que Jesús nos pide es que lo tengamos siempre presente a Él y a su Reino en el pensamiento; esto es lo principal, las demás cosas e intereses de este mundo podemos dejarlos en segundo lugar. Así pues, no permitamos que nada de lo que hay en esta vida —ya sean cosas buenas o malas, materiales o intangibles— ocupen el lugar de honor que solamente le corresponde al Señor en nuestro corazón. April 4, 2021 - May 23, 2021

Easter Sunday, is the greatest of all Sundays, and Easter Time is the most important of all liturgical times. Easter is the celebration of **the Lord's resurrection** from the dead, culminating in his Ascension to the Father and sending of the Holy Spirit upon the Church. **There are 50 days of Easter** from the first Sunday to Pentecost.

The **octave of Easter** comprises the eight days which stretch from the first to the second Sunday. It is a way of prolonging the joy of the initial day. In a sense, every day of the Octave is like a little Sunday.






