

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

This weekend we celebrate the Sunday of Divine Mercy. God’s greatest desire is to forgive us, pouring out His infinite mercy upon us so that we may be healed.



The Feast of the Divine Mercy is intended to open the gates of God’s Mercy and Forgiveness to those who have been away from the Church. To all who attend Mass on this Divine Mercy Sunday, and receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation within 10 days will receive the complete forgiveness (remission) of sins and punishment. The special graces promised by our Lord for Mercy Sunday can be received even with imperfect love for God, and imperfect contrition for sin—as long as the soul merely trusts in the Mercy of God, and clings to Him because of His promised benefits.

Consider inviting those you may know who are away from the church to return and receive the sacraments of reconciliation and Eucharist this day, and pray that through the Divine Mercy of Jesus, they will accept that invitation.

Discover the Origin of Divine Mercy Sunday, the Divine Mercy image, and the Chaplet

In the 1930s, Jesus chose a humble Polish nun, St. Maria Faustina Kowalska, to receive private revelations concerning Divine Mercy that were recorded in her Diary. St. Faustina’s Diary records 14 occasions when Jesus requested that a Feast of Mercy (Divine Mercy Sunday). On May 5, 2000, five days after the canonization of St. Faustina, the Vatican decreed that the Second Sunday of Easter would henceforth be known as Divine Mercy Sunday. DUDAS Y EL AMOR DE DIOS

En el segundo domingo de pascua, nosotros celebramos la Fiesta de la Divina Misericordia . Dios se ha mostrado con nosotros con todo su amor y misericordia. Hoy debemos renovar esa confianza y amor a Dios, como todos los días, pero especialmente en este tiempo pascual, donde recibimos su salvación a través de la entrega de su vida.

Pero en la devoción a la Divina Misericordia este mensaje toma un enfoque poderoso que llama a las personas a un entendimiento más profundo sobre el Amor ilimitado de Dios y la disponibilidad de este Amor a todos – especialmente a los más pecadores. En esta devoción según Santa Faustina lo resume así de rápido:

“— Pide su Misericordia. Dios quiere que nos acerquemos a Él por medio de la oración constante, arrepentidos de nuestros pecados y pidiéndole que derrame Su Misericordia sobre nosotros y sobre el mundo entero

— Sé misericordioso – Dios quiere que recibamos Su Misericordia y que por medio de nosotros se derrame sobre los demás


— Confía completamente en Jesús – Dios nos deja saber que las gracias de su Misericordia dependen de nuestra confianza. Mientras más confiemos en Jesús, más recibiremos.”

Que la celebración de este día nos ayude a ser misericordiosos y compasivos todo el año. El don de la paz se nos ha dado como un regalo del resucitado, el saludo de paz que Jesús dirige está dirigido hoy a nosotros también. Por otro lado las dudas asaltan a los apóstoles, seguramente a nosotros también en algún momento. Pedro cómo que no se fía de lo que decían las mujeres. Tomás exige ver las señales de los clavos en las manos y de la lanza en el costado.

Pero la duda tiene su aspecto positivo: evita que caigamos en el desatino o en lo irracional. Un creyente no es un crédulo que acepta todo sin pasarlo por el tamiz de la razón.

Un creyente de verdad tiene que pasar del fideísmo a la fe adulta, responsable y personalizada, que nos hace gritar: ¡Señor mío y Dios mío!; No creemos porque nos lo han dicho otros, sino porque nosotros mismos hemos experimentado la presencia de Jesús vivo en nuestra vida. Creer es fiarse de Alguien: Jesús de Nazaret, el Resucitado, que ha vencido a la muerte, dando un nuevo sentido a nuestras vidas. El mejor don que nos regala la fe en Jesús es la paz, plenitud de todos los dones. Es una paz que produce en nuestro interior una sensación profunda de felicidad y realización personal. Sin embargo, esta paz no puede quedar encerrada en nosotros mismos, sino que tiene que salir hacia afuera, tiene que notarse y ser testimoniada. La construcción de un mundo en paz es una tarea de todo cristiano, partiendo siempre de la justicia y el amor. Hoy la paz se siente amenazada por los atentados terroristas. Matar en nombre de Dios es una blasfemia, porque Dios nos regala siempre su paz. En este sentido, debemos nosotros examinarnos a nosotros mismos y ver hasta qué punto la presencia del espíritu de Jesús nos llena de paz y nos da suficiente ánimo y vigor para hacer frente a las adversidades interiores y exteriores que frecuentemente nos amenazan. Un alma llena del espíritu de Jesús, del espíritu de Dios, es un alma en paz, aunque por dentro y por fuera nos veamos frágiles e inseguros. Las propias dolencias físicas y las dolencias del alma que nos causan los acontecimientos exteriores no deben nunca robarnos la alegría y la paz interior. Los grandes santos fueron personas de una gran paz interior, aunque todos ellos tuvieron que sufrir mucho, en su lucha contra las tentaciones interiores y contra el mundo hostil que les rodeaba.

Pidamos a Dios que no nos falte nunca su espíritu, el espíritu de Dios, el Espíritu Santo. Vivamos la Paz que da El Resucitado, bendigámonos unos a otros con amor cristiano. Paz y Bien.t




Easter Season

In anticipation of the 51st annual Earth Day (April 22, 2021), recall that St. Francis of Assisi, renowned for his love of nature, was declared the patron saint of ecology by Pope John Paul II. The famous Francis poem (Canticle of the Creatures) has the refrain Praise be to You or Laudato Si', praising God's creation of the natural earth, or as Fr. Paul described in the 2021 Easter beach Mass, the cathedral built by God.

As the first pope to adopt the Assisi saint as a papal namesake, Pope Francis authored the encyclical "Laudato Si': On Care For Our Common Home".

Pope Francis says instead of viewing humanity as having dominion over the earth, we must see how everything is interconnected and all creation is a "universal family".

This calls to mind the naturalist John Muir saying "when we try to pick out anything by itself, we find it hitched to everything else in the Universe." Pope Francis further explains that social and environmental challenges are one complex crisis that must be solved holistically.
