FEAST OF THE ASCENSION

Also known as Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord, this feast is traditionally celebrated on a Thursday, the 40th day of Easter, and commemorates the bodily Ascension of Jesus into heaven. In the Archdiocese of Los Angeles, we celebrate the solemnity this **Sunday, May 16**. On the Solemnity of the Ascension, we reflect upon Christ's return to His Father in Heaven (Where He has gone, we hope to follow).

It is to your advantage that I go away, the Advocate will not come to you.

But if I go, I will send him to you. - John 16:7

En la segunda lectura de este domingo, San Pablo nos lo dice con estas palabras: “que el Dios del Señor Nuestro Jesucristo el Padre de la gloria les dé espíritu de sabiduría y revelación para conocerlo, ilumine los ojos de sus corazones, para que comprendan cuál es la esperanza a la que se les llama, cuál la riqueza de gloria que da en herencia a los santos.”

La esperanza cristiana lleva consigo una llamada a la misión y al compromiso; una invitación a no esperar del cielo soluciones milagrosas o revelaciones especiales. ¿Qué hacen ahí mirando al cielo? Eso nos dice la primera lectura, vayan al mundo entero y proclamen el Evangelio digan y anuncien que estoy vivo.

La llamada a la misión comenzó a realizarse en obediencia al mandato: «Ellos salieron a proclamar por todas partes, colaborando el Señor con ellos y

confirmando la Palabra con los signos que la acompañaban». Signos u obras que Dios obraba por medio de ellos, es así como debemos vivir la vida cristiana, haciendo el bien.

En el credo decimos o profesamos cada domingo, “subió al cielo y está sentado a la derecha del Padre”.

Estar junto al padre es estar en su Amor. Desde que Jesús ascendió al cielo, nosotros los que creemos en eso, esperamos estar junto a Él. Es una promesa en la casa de mi Padre hay muchas moradas y voy a prepararles un lugar, junto a Él, con Él. Por eso debemos vivir la Ascensión del Señor en compromiso, en fe, amor, haciendo lo que nos corresponde y que ayude a mi vida personal y a la de los demás a subir al cielo cada día. Esa es la meta, cada día nuestros actos deben indicar que estoy subiendo al cielo, pero aquí en la tierra, porque es aquí donde debemos mostrar lo que creemos y no solo mostrarlo, sino creerlo y proclamarlo.

La ascensión de Jesús no es solo su triunfo, obviamente es también nuestro triunfo, porque Él así lo decidió Dios, entrar a vivir la vida íntima de Dios, participar de su divinidad. Es celebrar que nuestras vidas están resucitadas junto a Él. Recordando que nuestra misión es ascender y caminar hacia la vida de salvación. Por eso es muy importante no dejarnos esclavizar por el pecado, por el mal, por la pereza, la indiferencia, la comodidad.

El cristiano no debe acomodarse y esperar sin hacer nada, nuestras vidas son para el bien, para la evangelización, para expandir el Reino de Dios con nuestras decisiones. Anunciar el evangelio, proclamar la buena nueva, es nuestra misión desde que Jesús partió al cielo después de la Resurrección. Hoy Jesús nos recuerda que como bautizados, nos debemos a los demás, en el sentido de nuestra misión. Que no nos digan, ¿qué hacen ustedes ahí parados mirando al cielo? . Que nos encuentre haciendo su voluntad.

Que la salvación recibida sea nuestro motivo de ascender, de caminar hacia su presencia diariamente. Amen.†

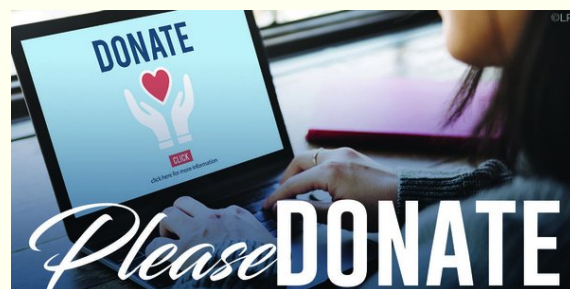

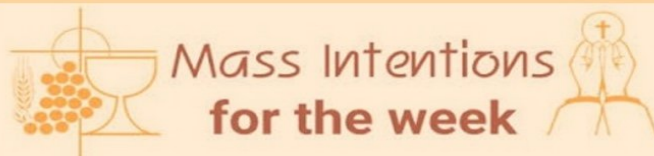
