

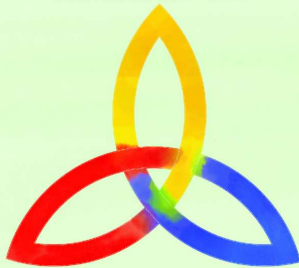

Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

The Church sets aside this Sunday to focus our attention on the mystery of the **Blessed Trinity, God who is one, but three persons—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit**. The Trinity is the central mystery of our faith. We believe that God is one, yet three: total unity and rich diversity. God is not a monolith, but a dynamic community of persons, a perfect, loving harmony of three. And the liturgy is the work of the Trinity. We begin all our liturgical celebrations with the sign of the cross, a reminder of our Trinitarian baptism, and the simplest of all professions of our faith. We believe that God is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and we gather in the name of this triune God. It is the Trinity who holds us together as well. In the words of Saint Cyprian, we are “a people made one by the unity of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit” (quoted in *Sacramentum Caritatis*, 16). —*Corinna Laughlin*,

Un mensaje del p. Carlos

DIOS UNO Y TRINO. SANTISIMA TRINIDAD.

A todos gracia y paz de parte de Dios Trino y Uno, hemos culminado el tiempo de la pascua y retomamos el tiempo ordinario el cual habíamos dejado cuando iniciamos la cuaresma, pero, continuamos con tiempo ordinario y vamos celebrando estos domingos con importantes misterios de la Iglesia, como la santísima trinidad, y Corpus Christi, que nos recuerdan ese amor tan grande de Dios y que la Iglesia reafirma en la liturgia dominical.

Hoy la liturgia de este día invita a celebrar al amparo de los textos bíblicos, el gozo de Dios en sí, su amor desbordado y su armonía en la diferencia. La fiesta de Dios trino nos abre a la experiencia de gestar misericordia después de haber sido mirados por ella; al sentimiento desarmado por la bondad, la luz y la ternura; a descubrir la verdad que convierte la propia existencia en auténtica revelación. La realidad que Dios es nos desconcierta, no tanto por incomprendible cuanto por inabarcable. Dios nos busca y nos incorpora a su mismo movimiento de éxtasis, nos adentra en nuestra raíz de la que brota lo que hacemos. Fluir en esa corriente conlleva el abandono de las ansias de control, la liberación del Yugo que supone la autorreferencia, el aprendizaje de la alegría que surge de la acogida escucha y compasión que nos transforman.

La Santísima Trinidad es el dogma fundamental del cristianismo. Consiste en la creencia de que Dios es uno y trino, es decir, es una unidad conformada por tres personas divinas relacionadas entre sí: el Padre, el Hijo y el Espíritu Santo. Nuestra fe y en el credo lo profesamos, creemos en un Dios trinitario: Dios Padre, Dios Hijo y Dios Espíritu Santo.

El catecismo de la Iglesia Católica lo define de la siguiente manera: La Trinidad es una. No confesamos tres dioses sino un solo Dios en tres personas: "la Trinidad consubstancial"... Las personas divinas no se reparten la única divinidad, sino que cada una de ellas es enteramente Dios: "El Padre es lo mismo que es el Hijo, el Hijo lo mismo que es el Padre, el Padre y el Hijo lo mismo que el Espíritu Santo, es decir, un solo Dios por naturaleza".

En nuestra piedad popular y lo usamos para la liturgia en los sacramentos, y en el diario vivir como cristianismo católicos, y es por medio de la señal de la cruz, que es trinitaria, nos ponemos bajo la protección del padre, del hijo y del Espíritu santo, esta es una protección e invocación que no debemos olvidar, cada día, encomendarnos y encomendar a los demás a la protección de la Santa Trinidad. Cuando en la liturgia iniciamos o terminamos lo hacemos poniéndonos en y bajo la adoración y protección de la Santísima Trinidad. Es como un sello para nosotros, lo hacemos en la frente para recordar y pensar en Dios, en la boca porque nos debemos disponer para anunciarlo y proclamarlo, con nuestros labios y en el corazón o en el pecho, porque es el lugar desde donde difundimos el amor y Él nos ama.

Si tuviésemos que resumir el mensaje del Antiguo Testamento en una sola afirmación, podríamos decir que consiste en el permanente empeño de Dios en manifestar su cercanía al pueblo. Desde el inicio de la Escritura se nos presenta a Dios en diálogo con el hombre y con su pueblo. Somos parte de esta herencia y llamada a ser en relación. Conviene recordarlo, pasarlo por el corazón. Necesitamos cultivo y cuidado expreso de la profundidad del ser que confiere sentido a la vida, pulso a la realidad, quicio a lo afectivo. La iniciativa de Dios Padre es el origen que nos capacita para ser originales, la fuente que sacia nuestra sed y torna transparente la soledad.

Gocemos de esta realidad de fe y acogamos en nuestras familias la presencia de Dios Trino y propáguenlos a los demás, no perdamos esa tradición tan importante, encomendarnos y bendecirnos unos a otros con el Dios Uno y Trino. Paz y Bien.†

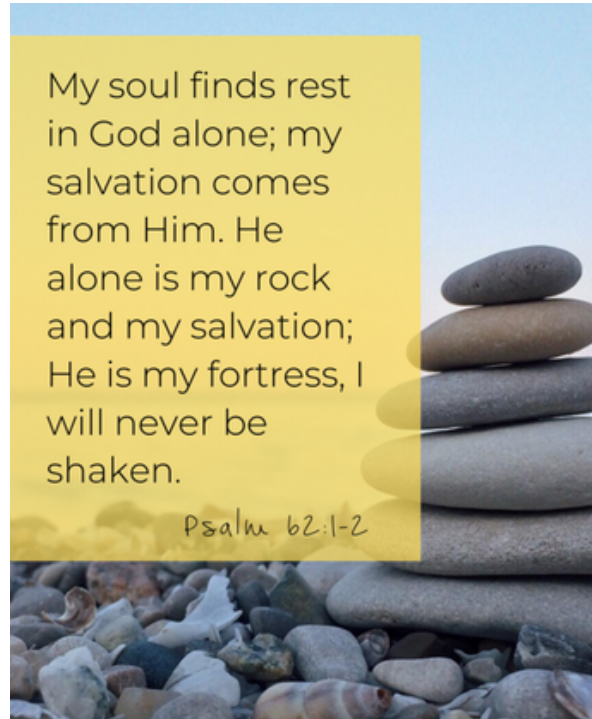

HOW TO PRAY WORKSHOP FOR TEENS

The essential habit of a spiritual life is daily prayer that includes not only speaking to God, but listening and experiencing God's love and presence. For years now, I have lead a workshop on how to pray for adults. But, inspired by the book "I Heard God Laugh" we gave out recently at Easter, it occurred to me that this is a message and teaching our Teens can benefit from too! The sooner one begins a prayer life, the greater the fruits it will produce. There is no greater gift one can give another than to help them pray and develop a close personal relationship with Jesus. This workshop will use the above mentioned book as the main text, but also teach many ways to pray. We will experience prayer together in this workshop, and each participant will be asked to pray daily on their own. At each class participants will have an opportunity to share their experiences in prayer and how God is speaking to our hearts and lives. Classes will be twice a month. 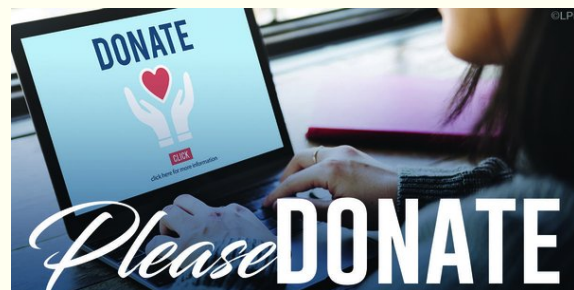


