## Un mensaje del p. Carlos

**EL VERDADERO PAN**

Nos estamos alimentando estos días del capítulo 6 de San Juan, muy importante para todos, reconocer y profundizar en la experiencia del Dios que vivo que se da y se reparte a todos y seguirlo o buscarlo pero por las verdaderas razones que Él desea que lo busquemos. En el Antiguo Testamento los Israelitas tuvieron un alimento providencial y ellos recordarán esa intervención de Dios ante sus quejas e inconformidades, fue algo gratuito. Dios que es grande y amoroso sigue sus pasos y los cuida, solamente porque los ha escogido como su pueblo de salvación.

El alimento que perdura. El texto del evangelio recoge la reflexión de Jesús después de la multiplicación de los panes. Jesús les cuestiona el motivo por el que le siguen. Lo que buscan es que Jesús repita su gesto y los vuelva a alimentar gratis. Jesús los desconcierta

con un planteamiento inesperado: "Trabajen, no por el alimento que perece, sino por el que perdura hasta la vida eterna". Pero ¿cómo no nos vamos a

preocupar por el pan de cada día? El pan es indispensable para vivir. Por eso Jesús se preocupa tanto de los hambrientos y mendigos que no reciben de los ricos ni las migajas que caen de su mesa. Enseña a sus seguidores a pedir cada día al Padre pan para todos sus hijos. Jesús les habla de un pan que no sacia solo el hambre de un día, sino el hambre y la sed de vida que hay en el ser humano. En nosotros hay un hambre de felicidad, de justicia para todos, un hambre de libertad, de paz, de verdad. Jesús se presenta como ese Pan que nos viene del Padre "para dar vida al mundo". Este Pan, venido de Dios, "perdura hasta la vida eterna".

Sólo Dios permanece para siempre. Alimentar el cuerpo es fácil, pero llenar el alma, el espíritu...sólo Dios tiene poder para hacerlo. El trabajo de los hombres es comer y dar de comer a todos. El trabajo de Jesús es darnos de comer el pan de vida, en este aquí y ahora, para el mañana y para siempre. Recibimos a Jesús en la Eucaristía. Celebrar la Eucaristía no es tanto un acto de piedad individual; mi Dios y yo, en íntima estrechez (a veces egoísta estrechez). Si convertimos la Eucaristía en un acto individualista e intimista, por más santidad y adoración que se le ponga, no deja de ser un culto vacío, que no conduce a la vida, "como el que comieron sus padres y murieron". Que nuestras eucaristías sean realmente comulgar en todo nuestro ser con Cristo encarnado en el hoy de nuestra historia para tener vida eterna. Lo recuerda San Agustín en el comentario de este evangelio: "Unos

por unos motivos, otros por otros, llenan todos los días la Iglesia. Apenas se busca a Jesús por Jesús. Me buscan, no por los signos que han presenciado,

sino porque han comido del pan que les di. Trabajen por el pan que no perece, sino que permanece hasta la vida eterna. Me buscan por algo distinto a mí, Búsquenme por mí mismo".

San Pablo dice, "Dejad que el Espíritu renueve vuestra mentalidad, y vestíos de la nueva condición humana, creada a imagen de Dios: justicia y santidad verdaderas" (Ef 4, 24).

Dejemos el paso libre a Dios para que nos renovemos como mujeres y hombres nuevos, revestidos de Cristo y vestidos de la condición de hijos de Dios, los que buscan a Dios no por los signos que hace sino porque lo tenemos como el centro de nuestras vidas y en El actuamos de acuerdo a su voluntad. Amen.

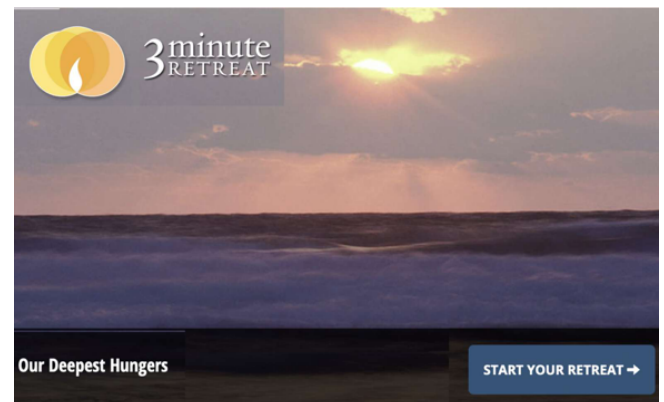
## OPPORTUNITIES TO GROW IN FAITH

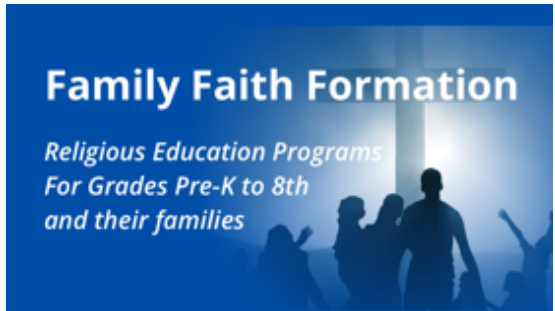
**Do you have a child between the age of 3-8?**

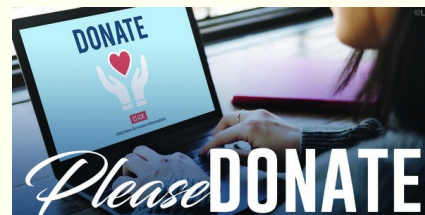
