#### **GOSPEL MEDITATION**

#### **Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture**

"Far be it from us to forsake the Lord for the service of other gods." We struggle with our gods. They appear in the forms of things like money, power, prestige, popularity, privilege, and self-fulfillment. We like these "gods" because they make us feel good and ask very little of us in return. When we worship them, we worship ourselves. How can you go wrong with that? We buy into the illusion that if something can give us a comfortable life, free of want and need, then it is worth setting other things aside to pursue it. In essence, we sell our souls. Our struggle with "who is God" and to whom do we belong is a real one and one that can easily find us empty and experiencing disillusionment.

The devil tempted Jesus in the desert and promised him more. We are promised "more." But in pursuing the more and the satisfying we lose track of the cost, and the cost is great. We sacrifice our very life in pursuit of something disguised as life. We sacrifice truth for something that only "feels" true. While the true and real God certainly promises us many things, many things are also required. It is not about the warm and secure feelings and self-absorption the world wants to provide, but of giving back. There can be no lukewarm stance with regard to faith. If we are in, then faith in Jesus Christ asks us to do some difficult things: work in service of God's kingdom (not our own), love our enemies, offer no resistance to injury, that we must die to ourselves in order to find ourselves, and trust that Jesus truly gives us his flesh and blood to eat and drink. These are hard things to accept and even harder to put into practice. It is no wonder that many, who may be attracted to Jesus at first, walk away in pursuit of the more self-satisfying gods.

But truth is truth. If we cannot accept it from the lips of Jesus Christ, then where else will we find it? To whom can we go? There is only one source of truth and life, Jesus Christ. Jesus has the words of eternal life and if we do not go to him, then where else will we find this gift? But we must be faithful and buy into the whole package deal that requires sacrifice and fidelity. When we do, we find ourselves, through the Body and Blood of Christ, connected to the Source of all life and then intimately bound with our brothers and sisters. We all have to decide whether we want to stay or go and if we can accept what Jesus has to say. It's a choice we all have to make.

#### ¿NOS VAMOS O PERMANECEMOS?

Hoy la liturgia de la palabra nos invita a cuestionarnos o revisarnos acerca de nuestro seguimiento a Jesús. ¿Qué significa? Estamos siendo fieles y entregados a la invitación de Él, vayan y evangelicen, vayan y bauticenlos en el Nombre del Padre y del Hijo y Del Espíritu Santo. Pero es que Jesús, quería eso: autenticidad y sinceridad en sus seguidores. La predicación de Jesús, lejos de ser una imposición, era y sigue siendo una propuesta. A nadie se nos obliga a llevar la cruz en el pecho y, mucho menos, a decir que somos cristianos si –por lo que sea- no lo tenemos claro.

Hoy, con más severidad que nunca, estamos viviendo una deserción de la práctica de fe. Parece que lo que se lleva, es decir "no soy practicante" "a mí la Iglesia no me va" "yo no me meto en esos rollos religiosos". En el fondo, hay un tema más grave: nadie quiere complicaciones. Los compromisos, de por vida, nos asustan; como en el evangelio de este domingo: encrespó el pelo a los demás, el modo de expresarse y las directrices que marcaba Jesús de Nazaret.

El Señor, porque sabe y conoce muy bien nuestra debilidad, siempre tiene sus puertas abiertas: unas veces para entrar y gozar con su presencia y, otras, igual de abiertas para marcharnos cuando –por lo que sea- nos resulta imposible cumplir con sus mandatos. Ahora bien; permanecer con Él, nos lo garantiza el Espíritu, es tener la firme convicción de que nunca nos dejará solos.

De que compartirá nuestros pesares y sufrimientos, ideales y sueños, fracasos y triunfos. Porque, fiarse del Señor, es comprender que no existen los grandes inconvenientes sino el combate, el buen combate desde la fe. Y Jesús, nos adiestra y nos anima en esa lucha contra el mal y a favor del bien.

--¿Cuándo hemos dejado al Señor solo? --¿Sabemos estar en su presencia sin más compañía que el silencio? -- ¿Nos planteamos, con frecuencia, lo que significa y conlleva el ser cristianos? --¿Nos duele, en algún momento, la proclamación de la Palabra de Dios?

Estos interrogantes, al final de esta breve reflexión dominical, pretenden incentivar nuestra fe dormida. Si creemos y servimos al Señor, que lo hagamos con valentía, con transparencia y sabedores de que, seguirle, aunque no sea un camino de rosas, merece la pena.

Digámosle, iré contigo Señor, porque eres el único que ofrece vida eterna, porque eres la verdad, el camino y la vida. Amen.

# RESPONDING Call

#### **EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP**

#### **Recognize God In Your Ordinary Moments**

Submission as Stewardship.

We aren't comfortable with the idea of submission. Our society champions equality, and rightly so — but it's a mistake to think that submission is at odds with equality. To submit ourselves fully, we must first be free. We must first be our own masters. God has granted us that freedom with the salvation He offers. We are no longer the slaves of sin. Now He asks us to be subordinate to one another, in the name of Christ.

What a completely uncomfortable task! What He's asking is for us to be subordinate to the person who irritates us the most. The person we really can't stand. The person who doesn't respect us or appreciate what we have to offer. The person we think we're smarter than, more talented than. The person we envy.

That's the real challenge of stewardship, isn't it? Subordination. Inconveniencing myself by giving of time, of money, of relationship. Putting the needs or wants of another above my own when they haven't done anything special to earn it.

I invite you to consider the cross — the most radical expression of submission, and of stewardship, that ever existed. If there was ever someone who deserved superiority, isn't it the God who let Himself be nailed to a tree, who gave so freely of His life, His body, His blood, His everything?

To look at him in his agony is to truly understand the beauty of submission — of laying down what you have for the good of the other.

#### Question:

We live in a country that upholds the separation of Church and state. What is the role of Catholics in society?

#### Answer:

As the lay faithful — that is, not vowed priest or religious — we are called to live and love in the circumstances of our daily lives. St. John Paul II wrote a document about the laity. In it he wrote, "In their situation in the world God manifests His plan and communicates to them their particular vocation of seeking the Kingdom of God by engaging in temporal affairs and by ordering them according to the plan of God" (On the Lay Members of Christ's Faithful, 15).

God wants us in the hospitals, the board rooms, the law offices, the food pantries, and the little league games! We are to engage in the affairs of the world. But when we're there, we should live the plan of God. We need to respect those around us, engage in just business and legal practices, and love our children. We should care for the earth, use our money wisely, and get to know our neighbors. We must advocate for social policies that respect human dignity and human freedom. No matter our state in life, we are invited to build the kingdom of God!





#### Practice empathy at home to prevent bullying

No parent sets out to raise a bully, but children grow and develop into their own people as they go out into the world — and it starts at home. One way to help your child foster healthy, kind relationships is to work on building good habits at home. Reward kindness and empathy when you see it. Comment on instances of sharing, of kindness, of pride. Help your child understand what it means to empathize with someone else, or to be kind in different situations.
