Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Albert Einstein said that the "true measure of intelligence is not knowledge but imagination." Being a disciple of Jesus Christ requires a great deal of imagination. It is not enough to simply attend to facts, rules and rituals and consider the job done. Quite contrarily, the Gospels demands creativity, of trying to discern how to put flesh on the Beatitudes and properly serve God's children. Jesus never doled out a top down agenda. Not once did he ever demand conformity over conversion or sacrifice over mercy. The Gospel is always about putting people in touch with their compassionate, forgiving, and unconditionally loving God and meeting them where they are.

For Jesus, it often meant breaking a few rules. Well respected and time-honored traditions had to be set aside in order to attend to what really mattered. God's compassion, mercy and true conversion were always the trump cards. The story of the Good Samaritan, healing on the Sabbath, and bypassing of purification rituals all display this theme. Human beings can get too hung up on protocol and tradition. This is so much so that often preserving all of these things is of greater concern than the beggar knocking on our door or the sinner looking for mercy. It is no wonder, then, that we can easily become hypocritical. Many can see us on our knees in prayer while our true heart and actions, rooted in judgment and self-preservation, are hidden from others. It is a trap into which we can easily fall. Who cares how we live our lives as long as our hands are properly washed!

Here enters the need for imagination and the distinction of truly being a wise and intelligent person. It takes a good measure of creativity and a lot of guts to really be a doer of God's word and not merely a hearer. Being a person who doesn't just tell people about God but shows people God requires courage and ingenuity. That's why people like St. Francis of Assisi and St. Teresa of Calcutta are timeless. Their genuineness speaks volumes generation to generation. It's risky business taking the step to allow God into our hearts. Permitting God to release us from the grip of our evil thoughts, infidelity, greed, malice, sexual improprieties, licentiousness, envy, arrogance, folly, and the like takes courage. That's why we prefer to spend our energy rearranging the future rather than take measures to secure a foundation that is most certainly crumbling.

¿QUIEN ES EL CENTRO?

Este domingo continuamos con la lectura del evangelio de San Marcos, y nos presentan las lecturas algo muy apegado a la cultura y tradiciones del momento, que tal vez a nosotros no nos dicen nada, sin embargo, la tradición sanitaria de lavarse las manos va muy de acuerdo con la prevención de ciertas enfermedades o virus, por ejemplo este tiempo de COVID 19 uno de los requisitos o recomendaciones es lavarse las manos siempre que volvamos o antes de comer etc, pero no es un conflicto y no es algo de fanatismo o de precepto religioso. En aquel tiempo era a veces una norma de los hombres y no tanto de Dios, lo que necesitamos limpio es el alma y nuestras acciones que irán en beneficio de los demás.

Claro que los mandamiento de Dios hay que vivirlos, respetarlos y amarlos, porque en realidad pretenden una vida mejor en todos sentido para las personas, porque nos ayudan a liberarnos, pero también a comprometernos con lo esencial. Si la religión, de alguna manera, nos ofrece una imagen de Dios, y si en ella no aparece el Dios salvador, entonces los hombres no podrán buscar a ese Dios con todo el corazón y con toda el alma. La especulación de adjudicar cosas que se presentan como de Dios, cuando responden a intereses humanos de clases, de grupos, es todo un reto para discernir la cuestión que se plantea en el evangelio de hoy. Esta es una constante cuando la religión no es bien comprendida. Jesús lo deja claro: lo que mancha es lo que sale de un corazón pervertido, egoísta y absurdo. La verdadera religión nace de un corazón abierto y misericordioso con todos los hermanos

Algo así le ocurrió a Jesús Maestro. Se encontró a su paso, con personas que –perdidas y ancladas en puros formalismos, gente con los ojos puestos en lo que dirán, en la legalidad y no el amor - olvidaban lo importante: el amor, el perdón, la caridad. Pendientes del adorno y de las filacterias, de las normas y de las directrices, olvidaban el final de todo ello: Dios. A los fariseos les ocurría lo de aquellos turistas que, de tanto mirar a las señales de tráfico, arrinconaban el disfrute del paisaje y la visión de las poblaciones por las que cruzaban con sus coches.

Jesús quiere poner en el centro de todo a Dios. Todo aquello que distorsiona esa voluntad, que impide llegar hasta el amor de Dios, no tiene vigencia o deja de tener sentido. La ley de Dios, la suprema, es el amor. ¿Qué ocurría entonces? Ni más ni menos que, el conjunto de normas que indicaban cómo llegar hasta el amor de Dios se habían convertido en objeto de adoración, en el centro de toda reverencia. Hasta tal punto que, ellas y sólo ellas, eran causa de salvación o de condenación.

¿Cuál es el gozo de Dios? Que le amemos desde la libertad y no por obligación. A un padre no se le aprecia porque un papel me dice que soy su hijo, sino porque previamente he sentido su cuidado, su palabra, su protección o su corrección fraterna. Con el amor de Dios pasa tres cuartos de lo mismo: es un amor gratuito, un don que se nos da. ¿Qué ofrecer nosotros a cambio? ¿Un te quiero porque me das? ¡Por supuesto que no! ¡Un te quiero, Dios, ¡porque eres mi Padre y sé que me amas! Bendiciones, Paz y Bien.

Pop culture has given us a unique idea of the term justice. Justice, we often think, is about taking. Taking what's owed. Taking revenge. Taking what we deserve. This worldview tends to make mincemeat of our Catholic social teachings. Seeking the good of the poor, a call to community and participation, solidarity — on the face of it, in a society where everything must be earned and we are encouraged to hoard for ourselves whatever success we can achieve, these principles look a lot like highway robbery.

But when you remember the presence of an omnipotent, all-loving and all-merciful God, it turns our gunslinging sense of justice on its head. For how does justice inhabit the same universe as a God who is so quick to give and indeed to forgive?

Well, very easily, when we remember Who exactly is the source of every good and perfect thing in this world. There is no law that cannot be traced back to the Word. And the Word saves our souls.

Is that justice? No, that is a gift. It is the reckless, indulgent gift of a father whose love is greater than His anger. What is justice in the Biblical sense?

The answer is simple. Look at your life. See the hours in your day? See your spouse, your kids, your grandkids? See the house they live in, the money in your wallet, the food in your fridge, the breath in your lungs?

Calling it all your own, refusing to share any of it — that's robbery. Giving it all back to the One who gave it to you — that's justice.

Answer:

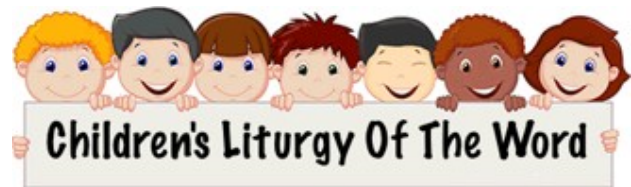
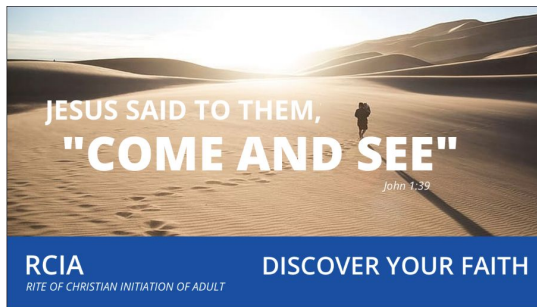
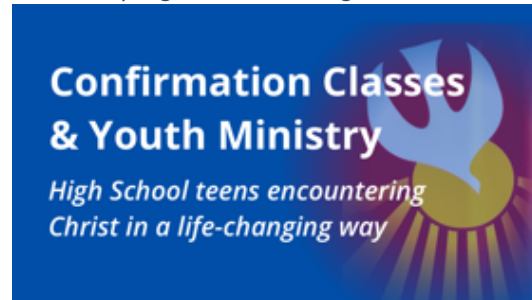
There are a lot of ways to bring up the topic of religion, without being judgmental or pushy. Begin by asking what her thoughts are about religion, or what her experience was growing up. Finding common ground is often easier than you think, because the questions and problems we have about God, the presence of evil, our purpose in life, and our relationship with God are universal concerns.

Why are you afraid? If you do not want to insult or offend someone, don't be pushy or judgmental. If you are uncertain about how to explain your own faith, do a little reading or practice with a friend. If you measure success only by this person converting, focus your attention more on beginning the conversation, not on bringing it to a perfect close! Faith is a journey of many acts of belief, many discussions about God, and many choices about how we practice what we preach. In some we will have great success; in others we will need forgiveness and perseverance. The most important thing to keep in mind is that the Holy Spirit is always at work and our most humble efforts can bear great fruit. Have faith in God because He has faith in you!

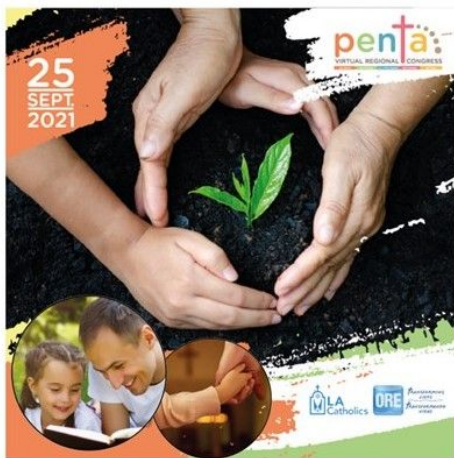
Preparation Infant Baptism

Safeguard the Children

Teach children how to answer the door safely

You would never knowingly let someone dangerous or unsafe into your home. But it is impossible to fully vet every stranger — maintenance worker, new neighbor, salesperson, etc — who shows up at your door. Teach children a few tips about answering (or not answering) the doorbell. Consider these rules, or something similar, for your family: Always look to see who is at the door first. If the person is a stranger, get an adult to answer the door. Do not open the door to someone you do not know. For more information, request a copy of the VIRTUS

Enseñe a los niños cómo abrir la puerta de forma segura

Usted jamás permitiría a sabiendas que alguien peligroso o inseguro entrara en su hogar. Pero es imposible examinar completamente a cada extraño (trabajador de mantenimiento, nuevo vecino, vendedor, etc.) que se presente a su puerta. Enseñe a los niños algunos consejos sobre cómo contestar (o no contestar) cuando tocan a la puerta o cuando suena el timbre. Considere estas reglas, o algo similar, para su familia: Siempre vea primero por una ventana o por la mirilla de la puerta para ver quién está en la puerta. Si la persona es un extraño, el niño o joven debe pedir a un adulto que abra la puerta. No abra la puerta a alguien que no conozca.
