

GOSPEL MEDITATION

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

We need to get our bearings straight and properly lay life's cornerstone. Otherwise, the rest of our journey will be skewed, and our judgment clouded. We can recall Jesus' famous rebuke of Peter, "You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do." Even he, as one of Jesus' closest friends struggles with understanding things and grasping the big picture. Pierre Teilhard de Chardin (1881-1955) a renowned and learned French Jesuit priest often has these words attributed to him: "We are not human beings having a spiritual experience. We are spiritual beings having a human experience." Whether they were actually from his lips, they certainly mimic his thought. These wise words orient us and capture the essence of who we really are.

Many people consider spirituality an option. It is no wonder that they come to this conclusion when they predominantly define themselves using human terms and concepts. Immersed in this world view, they struggle finding any semblance of God because God does not work according to human expectations! This is especially true when suffering and death enter life's picture. If we are only human beings having a spiritual experience, then we wrongly expect our spirituality to serve us as we desire. The human expectation is that my spiritual life is something that is useful in avoiding pain, hardship, and death, not something that gives the courage to live through it!

So, when we protest and get upset with God because our journey is becoming difficult, painful, treacherous, disappointing, and even pointing us toward death, Jesus rebukes us as he did Peter and gently reminds us how to see. It is God who inspires and opens hearts to see truth and beauty. In God, the true meaning of things is understood, and we receive a depth of insight and understanding that is not found following purely human paths. It is not our task to understand God, as God is beyond human understanding. Ours is the joyful privilege of simply resting in God's presence simply because God is God and we are who we are. As spiritual beings having an exciting and adventurous human experience, it is in our DNA to do so. Through prayer we can let go and let be. This is how we lose our lives but then save them.

Un mensaje del p. Carlos

¿ES JESUS MI META Y GUÍA, EN EL ESTAMOS PONIENDO NUESTRA FE Y ESPERANZA?

La experiencia con Jesús de Nazareth ciertamente es muy personal, íntima y de compromiso, posiblemente no hablemos de eso, tal vez con algunos o en nuestra reunión con los de la Iglesia pueda ser, pero ojala que al menos personalmente tengamos una respuesta, la pregunta es : ¿quién es Jesús para mí?

Pero ante la pregunta: “Y ustedes ¿quién dicen que soy”, no nos pregunta solo para que nos pronunciemos sobre su identidad misteriosa, sino también para que revisemos nuestra relación con él. ¿Qué le podemos responder desde nuestras comunidades? La respuesta de Pedro: “Tú eres el Mesías”, o sea el Enviado del Padre. Es exacta: Dios ha amado tanto al mundo que nos ha regalado a Jesús. ¿Sabemos acoger, cuidar, disfrutar y celebrar este gran regalo de Dios? ¿Es Jesús el centro de nuestra vida cotidiana y de nuestras celebraciones, encuentros y reuniones? Por fin parece que todo está claro. Jesús es el Mesías enviado por Dios y los discípulos lo siguen para colaborar con él. Pero Jesús sabe que no es así.

La liturgia de este domingo –como la de todos los domingos– nos da una respuesta a la pregunta de Jesús. Cuando la primera lectura, del Libro de Isaías nos ofrece el texto del Varón de Dolores, la profecía que narra con gran exactitud, va a definir, también con toda exactitud, cómo iba a ser la misión del Mesías: “El Hijo del Hombre tiene que padecer mucho, tiene que ser condenado por los senadores, sumos sacerdotes y letrados, ser ejecutado y,

resucitar a los tres días”. Así lo expresa claramente Jesús a sus discípulos, aunque ellos no lo entendieran, porque no concebían a un Mesías derrotado y humillado. Jesús anuncia de alguna forma el prodigioso misterio de la Cruz, alegría y celebración para muchos y causa de condenación para otros porque no entendieron que de la Cruz brotó la vida, vida en abundancia para los que lo siguen y creen en que Él era el Hijo de Dios.

Seguimos hoy con Santiago en la segunda lectura muy directa con respecto a nuestra fe y nuestras obras, no hay forma de perderse. Hoy habla de la fe con obras, esa fe que si no tiene obras está muerta. Pablo venía a decir que la fe ya era suficiente para llegar a la meta. La cuestión, de todos modos, es que si tenemos auténtica fe en Jesucristo intentaremos hacer las obras que él hizo y esas obras se traducen en el apoyo a los hermanos, a la mejora de su salud y al mejor conocimiento de la misión humana que Dios Padre ha puesto en las manos de los todos los hombres y mujeres de todos los tiempos.

Hagamos revisión de nuestra relación con Dios, con los demás y conmigo mismo, es importante para que demos hoy respuesta a lo que Jesús pregunta. San Francisco de Asís decía, hermanos, hagamos el bien porque hasta hoy poco o nada hemos hecho. Jesús nos enseñó lo que debemos hacer. Paz y bien.

Can You Walk the Walk?

I've met and talked with enough people to feel confident that if you polled 100 fallen-away Catholics about why they didn't want anything to do with the Church, the term "accountability" would pop up in almost all of their answers.

And to be fair, a lack of accountability isn't just a Catholic problem. Talking the talk but not walking the walk has been a shortcoming handed down throughout the ages, across all creeds and nationalities.

Loving our neighbor, welcoming the stranger, clothing the naked, feeding the poor — it all sounds fantastic, especially when we're the ones saying it. But the doing — well, that's a different story, isn't it? We would do well to remember that Christ calls one of his best friends "Satan" when Peter tries to convince Jesus to stray from his destiny.

Have you ever been called Satan by one of your good buddies? I'll bet it's not a great feeling. But think about what Peter was doing. He had just said, "You are the Christ." And now, mere moments later, he's saying: "Don't say these things. Don't say you're going to suffer. Don't say you'll be killed."

He was telling Christ to squander what the Lord had given him. He was telling him that having faith was fine, but being faithful? It's just a little too hard. God has a destiny for you, too, and He's asking you to be open to it. Maybe it's not in your comfort zone. Maybe you don't think you can do it.

Lord, give us faith — but help us, also, to do the work.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained:

Question:

I've noticed that when I go to Mass at different parishes, sometimes people say and do different things. Why is that?

Answer:

The Mass in its current form has taken shape over the course of 2,000 years. Over time, traditions, structures, and prayers have been put into place. There are certain rubrics for the Mass that are normative wherever you go. This means you could attend Mass in Malawi or Thailand or Italy and still watch the same basic liturgy unfold, even if you don't understand the language. There may be some cultural differences from place to place, things that aren't specifically listed. For example, in the United States most people go up for Communion in a nice neat line. In Europe, everyone gets up around the same time. It's a bit of a free-for-all!

Some people might take it upon themselves to change things individually. People may not like something that feels too "liberal" or "conservative," and they may take a well-meaning stance in the opposite direction. When people (including the presiders) do things that are distracting or change the liturgy, it introduces an element that breaks the unity of the assembled community. The important thing to remember is that we gather as the Body of Christ to celebrate the Eucharist. If you are confused, ask! If you are frustrated, pray for the spirit of charity.



What to do if you are worried about family abduction

Family abduction happens when a child is taken or hidden by one family member from another, against custody or visitation rights. In some circumstances, family abduction is considered a crime, and can be prosecuted. If you are worried about a possible family abduction, you can take action. Have a valid custody agreement that outlines who can see or take your child, and when.
