## GOSPEL MEDITATION

### Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

What are the little ones? They are the poor, the marginalized, the women and men at the well, the Zacchaeus' looking for Jesus from a tree, those mired in sin, the blind who want to see, and the lame who want to walk. They are the lepers and the different ones who have been told that they are unclean, and the ones who suffer from abuse and grave injustices and oppression. They are children who want nothing more than to be loved and enjoy celebrating their innocence. These are all the little ones and they are all vulnerable. Life already brings them burdens, we don't need to add to them.

St. Oscar Romero said, "When the church hears the cry of the oppressed it cannot but denounce the social structures that give rise to and perpetuate the misery from which the cry arises." Why are so many people still so gravely hurting? We have the resources and the means to make things better. We choose not to. There are still those things called greed, pride, lust, apathy, jealousy, gluttony, and anger that prevent us from seeing each other and people to be loved and not objects to be used. Is this how God intended things to be?

God loves what is good and upright. It doesn't matter who did it or where it came from. In God's eyes, the end result is always faith, hope, and love. Those will always unite a person with God. We fill our lives with many things that are not good either for ourselves or for others. All of us have to work to discover what it is, exactly, that leads to the world's brokenness. There are people, systems, and ideologies in place that foster oppression and injustice rather than equity and fairness. Sadly, our complacency can be the greatest evil. Turning a blind eye, ignoring the truth, and believing that we are helpless to fix so great a problem, does little to move us closer to the kingdom of God. As members of the Body of Christ, we cannot condone anything that keeps people in misery.

As it is said, charity begins at home. Perhaps a good place to start is with our own households and making sure their foundations are properly laid.

## Un mensaje del p. Carlos

### Profetizar en Nombre de Dios.

Este domingo, La liturgia de la palabra nos invita a la «cultura del nosotros». La humanidad no es un conjunto de individuos aislados». Toda la persona es mi «prójimo» que necesita de una mano amiga y solidaria. Por tanto, el Maestro de Nazaret, nos propone a vivir como Él al servicio del reino de Dios, haciendo la vida de las personas más humana, más digna y dichosa, para seguir construyendo una Iglesia verdaderamente fraterna y empática, movido por su espíritu que busca el bien de todos sus hijos, en especial de los más necesitados.

En el evangelio de hoy Jesús nos enseña a estar abierto al bien y a la tolerancia para promover “la cultura del encuentro” y del dialogo que tanto necesita nuestra sociedad, hoy. Alegrémonos de que se haga el bien y las buenas obras, aunque no se nos haya ocurrido a nosotros sino a personas de buena voluntad que anhelan un mundo mejor para todos. No monopolizar el Espíritu. El relato del Libro de los Números enseña que son muy diversas las actuaciones del Espíritu. Una de ellas es hablar en lenguas. Otra, más importante, es el haber recibido el encargo de dirigir y enseñar al pueblo de Dios. Desde Moisés, representante de Dios (que no hablaba en lenguas ni profetizaba con trances), el Espíritu se derrama sobre los inspirados. No siempre Dios comunica su espíritu por los canales oficiales. El Espíritu es soberano por encima de las instituciones.

En el decreto “Ad Gentes”, del Concilio Vaticano II, se habla en dos ocasiones, comentando la famosa frase de San Justino “Semina Verbi”, de las semillas del Verbo que existen, sin duda, en otras religiones no católicas. Se dice en concreto: Los fieles descubran con gozo y respeto las semillas del Verbo que se ocultan en las tradiciones nacionales y religiosas de

los países de misión (AG II). El Espíritu Santo, que llama a todos los hombres a Cristo por las semillas del Verbo y por la predicación del Evangelio.

El carisma no debe ser rechazado por la autoridad. El presente pasaje de los Números confiere un carácter sagrado al origen de la institución de los ancianos, fundando así la importancia que tuvo siempre tanto religiosa como política. Los celos de Josué anticipan la misma actitud de los discípulos de Jesús frente al exorcista que arrojaba demonios sin ser de su grupo (evangelio de hoy). La gran tentación de la autoridad religiosa ha sido siempre monopolizar el Espíritu, pero el Espíritu se comunica a quien quiere y como quiere. Los que mandan no deberían estar celosos de que el pueblo profetice alguna vez; más bien debiera tomar nota de lo que dice Pablo a los obispos: "No apaguen el Espíritu".

El ejemplo que Moisés le da a Josué nos tiene que mover a nosotros a recordar que hay muchos que tal vez no son católicos pero que están profetizando y están haciéndolo en nombre de Jesús El que murió y en la cruz y resucito. Y otros como instituciones humanitarias, personas, asociaciones hacen el bien especialmente hacia los mas abandonados, ellos también están profetizando y están impulsando la vida humana a una mejor condición a ser mas dignos como personas, también esto es profetizar, también esto es invocar el Espíritu de Dios, aunque no lo digan así, pero están haciendo el bien en nombre del Amor y el Amor viene de Dios. Paz y Bien.

#### Recognize God In Your Ordinary Moments

##### Breaking the Stewardship Mold

Have you noticed how we always tend to pigeonhole one another — and ourselves? “I could never serve on the Parish Council. That’s for Rick and Ellen and that whole group of people who have done it for years.” “Greg takes care of faith formation in the parish — he always has. He doesn’t need my help.” “I can’t afford to give the big bucks like those families who sit up front can. My offering wouldn’t matter even if I did increase it.”

Thinking like this is a good indication that we aren’t in conversation with God about what His will is for our lives. If we have already decided what we are and are not meant to do, we aren’t likely to pray over it, to discern it.

We have to be open to the spirit of the Lord wherever it leads us, regardless of what we or others have come to expect from us. We human beings come to believe that we are such good judges of what others can offer — or what we ourselves can offer. But God has plans for us to which we aren’t privy. God calls everyone to serve Him in the way that pleases Him best, and only He can decide what that is. Everyday Stewardship demands a continual accounting of who we can be, what we can offer — even if it’s outside our comfort zone, even if it’s something that never occurred to us before.

There’s only one Person who can tell us what God wants from us. Do we even think to ask Him?

### WHY DO WE DO THAT?

#### Catholic Life Explained:

##### Question:

What do Catholics believe about the resurrection of the dead?

##### Answer:

Every Sunday, we proclaim in the Creed that we believe “in the resurrection of the body.” Does that mean Christ’s resurrection or our own? Both! Jesus’ resurrection is part of the work of salvation, but it’s also a sign of what’s to come. While death separates our bodies and our souls, this was not the intention of God when He first created us. It’s an effect of original sin. At the end of time, our bodies and our souls will be reunited.

Scientifically, we may have questions about this, since bodies decompose over the course of centuries. Or what about the saints, whose relics are spread around the earth? How the resurrection will happen is a mystery. But we know that our resurrected body will be our body. If we are in heaven, our body will be in a glorified state. Some theologians speculate what this glorification will be like based on Jesus’ resurrected body. Will we be able to walk through walls? Will we eat, since Jesus broke bread with his disciples? We don’t really know the answers to these questions. We do know, however, that we will be free from the effects of the fall (such as sickness and pain) and physical defects that occurred in life. Christ redeems us as whole persons, body and soul!




