PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE

Liberty Utilities

President – California (January 2017 – December 2017)

Ms. Bruno was responsible for the operational, financial and environmental performance of the three Liberty Utilities in California. These included Liberty Utilities (Cal Peco Electric) LLC providing electrical service to about 49,000 customers on the California side of Lake Tahoe, Liberty Utilities (Apple Valley Ranchos) Corp. providing potable water service to about 71,000 customers in the Town of Apple Valley, and Liberty Utilities (Park Water) Corp providing potable and recycled water to about 126,600 customers in southeast Los Angeles County.

Senior Vice President and General Manager, Liberty Utilities (Park Water) Corp, (April 2000- December 2016).

Ms. Bruno managed a staff of 49 to provide retail potable and recycled water service to about 126,600 people in seven communities in Southern California. She was responsible for a budget of about \$36 million in revenues and \$13 million in capital expenditures. In addition, Ms. Bruno managed operation and maintenance contracts for Central Basin Municipal Water District's recycled water systems that extend over 70 miles and deliver 5,000 acre-feet of recycled water annually to more than 280 industrial, commercial and landscape irrigation sites.

The Metropolitan Water District of Southern California

(March 1988 - April 2000)

Ms. Bruno was acting Associate Director of Water Quality and managed the technical, research, budget, and personnel issues for the Water Quality Division that included about 120 professionals and a budget of approximately \$12 million. When she was manager of the Financial Planning Branch, she was responsible for financial planning analyses and developing water rates and charges sufficient to fund Metropolitan's revenue requirements of over \$800 million. Ms. Bruno also directed local supply and water management programs to increase water recycling and develop local groundwater supply and storage resources in Southern California.

MWH (formerly James M. Montgomery, Consulting Engineers, Inc.)

(July 1981 to March 1988)

Ms. Bruno designed treatment process elements, developed design criteria, conducted treatment plant evaluations, prepared detailed specifications, and provided construction management services. She was technical editor of the 700-page Montgomery textbook entitled Water Treatment Principles and Design.
